

### **Lent Begins This Week**

On Wednesday March 1st we put upon ourselves the ashes signifying our Lenten Penance. The Roman Missal gives two formulas for the conferring of the ashes. The traditional formula is "Remember man that thou art dust, and unto dust you shall return." An additional formula was added to the Roman Missal in the edition released by Blessed Pope Paul VI in 1970 saying: "Repent, and believe in the Gos**pel."** Whether the traditional formula is used, or the newer formula, the purpose of the prayer is the same to remind the believer that following Christ requires penance. The traditional formula accomplishes

this by calling to mind the reality of death. In chapter 6:23 in his epistle to the Romans the blessed apostle Saint Paul wrote: "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Simply put, death and decay comes on account of sin entering the world. The traditional formula reminds us that we are sinners, and one day we will die and become like dust and ash. Our hope for life beyond the grave, life beyond entropy, a life not touched by sin is rooted in continually receiving the gift of God, which we call the life of grace. When we repent and believe in the Gospel we turn away from our sinfulness, those things which weaken or have broken off our relationship with God, and the Lord restores us to His life within our souls. Repentance is an ongoing reality, since it often takes a lifetime and more "to be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect". The great mercy of God which flows to us when we repent and recognize our need for God's life within our soul is what we hope Lenten practices accomplish for us.

The Lenten disciplines are three, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We are called to a more intense life of **prayer**. It is in prayer that we discover God's will for our life. It is in prayer that we learn the areas of our life where our thoughts, words, or actions hinder the development of our relationship with God. It is in prayer that the Lord shows us where we need to repent in order to bear more fruit. Fasting is a practice whereby we limit our intake of the goods of this world so we are more open to the goods of eternity. Whether it be food or some other thing, when thinking about the ways in which we can fast we should ask ourselves this question: What material things do I place ahead of God in my life? What material things get in the way of my life with God and the practice of my faith? Whether it is food, or Facebook, or shopping, fasting or some other kind of fast, fasting promotes detachment from earthly realities and opens us to heavenly things. Almsgiving is the manifestation of the gift of self, and so assists us in our imitation of Christ. Just as our God has been generous with us, so we are called to make a gift or ourselves whether is time, a concrete good deed, or a gift of our resources, when we do these things we are acting life

May God guide you in your discernment of the myriad of ways that you can pray, fast, and give alms during the holy season of Lent.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED Ouestion:

Carnivale and Mardi Gras celebrations are linked to Ash Wednesday, Lent, fast, and abstinence. What are the connections between these events?

#### Answer:

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the forty days known as Lent. The recommended practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving become the focus of Lenten activity and ritual. Each of these spiritual practices is aimed at personal discipline as well as continued concern for the other, especially the poor or alienated. Relying on God's providence and care, no matter how difficult life becomes, is crucial to Lenten spirituality. Fasting was initially stricter, permitting only one simple meal a day without meat, fish, or other delicacies. Such things were not even allowed in the house. So in order to prepare for this in an age of no refrigeration, people gathered to consume whatever was not allowed during Lent. This led to parties or celebrations originally referred to as Carnivale, literally meaning "goodbye to meat," or Mardi Gras, literally meaning "Fat Tuesday." The eating and celebrating ended on the Tuesday just before Ash Wednesday.
