

Lenten Traditions: The Veiling of Crucifixes & Statues As We Enter Passiontide Written on Tuesday March 28, 2017

As we come to the fifth Sunday of Lent we begin a period known as Passiontide. The veiling of the crucifix and statuary throughout the Church, save for the Stations of the Cross, is an ancient custom in the Roman Church. In the traditional Roman Liturgical Calendar the

fifth Sunday of Lent is known as Passion Sunday, not because an account of the passion is read, but rather because beginning this Sunday the liturgical texts and prayers which heretofore had been concerned with penitential disciplines such as fervent prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, now begin to focus more intensely on the sufferings our Lord endured for our salvation, and the events leading to his passion and death.

In the Roman liturgical calendar promulgated in 1969, Passion Sunday is renamed the fifth Sunday of Lent. In fact, the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent were directly tied to the restoration of the rite of scrutinies which are prayers, minor exorcisms, and blessings conferred upon elect catechumens preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil. The long Gospels we have been reading are imported from the Ancient Ambrosian Rite based in Milan. They are meant to accompany the elect catechumens on their journey to Baptism. On the third Sunday of Lent we have the Samaritan Woman at the Well, on the fourth Sunday we have the man born blind whose sight is restored, and on the fifth Sunday of Lent we have the resurrection of Lazarus. These Gospels are assigned to Year A of the revised Roman Lectionary. Since they are connected to the scrutinies they can also be used in Year B, and Year C of the three-year cycle if the scrutinies of the elect catechumens will take place. Even with the reintroduction of the scrutinies the fifth Sunday of Lent still marks the beginning of focusing on the Passion. The veiling of the Crucifix and Statuary throughout the Church calls to mind how our Lord, on his last pilgrimage to Jerusalem deliberately hid Himself from the leaders of the Sanhedrin who began seeking to arrest Him. Our Lord remained hidden from the authorities until the time appointed by our heavenly Father for the Lord to make His final journey to Calvary.

During the middle ages in some parts of the Christian world the veilings were begun on the first Sunday of Lent. When done in this way, the entire sanctuary was veiled from floor to ceiling. At some point the Roman Church introduced the practice of veiling corresponding with the fifth Sunday of Lent or Passion Sunday. It came to be done in a very practical way since only the statuary and crucifixes were veiled. The absence of something and the deliberate withholding of it from our senses is meant to heighten our sense of its importance. This becomes evident when the crucifix is unveiled and restored to our eyes on Good Friday as we venerate the wood of the cross. The statuary is returned to us as the great Easter Vigil is celebrated. These customs serve to make Lent a memorable time. I am sure that you can name many Lenten customs and traditions which bring deep meaning to your journey of faith. I pray that as we follow these customs they will likewise aid you in your appreciation of the holy season of Lent.
