

Pastor's Page Fr. Bryan J.B. Pedersen

The Sacrament of Confirmation: Be Sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

Last Monday May 15th at the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis. 10th grade students from Sacred Heart received the sacrament of Confirmation. A word which little means "to be made firm with" the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is a strengthening of Baptismal Grace. Archbishop Hebda conferred the sacrament associating with himself Fr. Mike Van Sloan to assist, the senior priest present to assist with the anointing with Chrism. They have worked hard to prepare for this holy sacrament. May the gifts of the Spirit be active in your lives! The recent celebration of this sacrament for our 10th graders as well as the coming feast of Pentecost in two week gives us an opportunity to reflect upon the meaning of Confirmation. Let us look at some excerpts from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u> for some more wisdom.



1285 Baptism, the Eucharist, and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the "sacraments of Christian initiation," the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. (Cf. Roman Ritual, Rite of Confirmation (OC), Introduction 1) For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." (LG 11; Cf. OC, Introduction 2)

1293a In treating the rite of Confirmation, it is fitting to consider the sign of anointing and what it signifies and imprints: a spiritual seal.

1294b The post-baptismal anointing with sacred chrism in Confirmation and ordination is the sign of consecration. By Confirmation Christians, that is, those who are anointed, share more completely in the mission of Jesus Christ and the fullness of the Holy Spirit with which he is filled, so that their lives may give off "the aroma of Christ." (2 Cor. 2:15)

1295a By this anointing the confirmand receives the "mark," the seal of the Holy Spirit. A seal is a symbol of a person, a sign of personal authority, or ownership of an object. (Cf Gen 38:18; 41:42; Deut 32:34; CT 8:6.)

1296 Christ himself declared that he was marked with his Father's seal. (Cf. Jn 6:27.) Christians are also marked with a seal. This seal of the Holy Spirit marks our total belonging to Christ, our enrollment in his service for ever, as well as the promise of divine protection in the great eschatological trial. (Cf. Rev 7:2-3; 9:4; Ezek 9:4-6.)

1303 From this fact, Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace:

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!"; (Romans 8:15)
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect; (Cf. LG 11)
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross: (Cf. Council of Florence (1439): DS 1319; LG 11; 12.)

"Recall then that you have received the spiritual seal, the spirit of <u>wisdom</u> and <u>understanding</u>, the spirit <u>of right judgment (counsel)</u> and <u>courage (fortitude)</u>, the spirit of <u>knowledge</u> and <u>reverence</u>, the spirit of <u>holy fear in God's presence</u>. Guard what you have received. God the Father has marked you with his sign; Christ the Lord has confirmed you and has placed his pledge, the Spirit, in your hearts. (St. Ambrose De myst. 7,42:PL 16,402-403.)

1304 Like Baptism which it completes, Confirmation is given only once, for it too imprints on the soul an indelible spiritual mark, the "character," which is the sign that Jesus Christ has marked a Christian with the seal of his Spirit by clothing him with power from on high so that he may be his witness. (Cf. Council of Trent (1547): DS 1609; Lk 24:48-49.)

1305 This "character" perfects the common priesthood of the faithful, received in Baptism, and "the confirmed person receives the power to profess faith in Christ publicly and as it were officially (quasi Ex officio)." (cf. St. Thomas Aquinas, STh III,72,5, ad 2.)

Archbishop Hebda reminded the newly confirmed of the necessity to unwrap the gift of Confirmation that they have received. It reminded me that the gifts of the spirit, the seal of the Holy Spirit, requires our cooperation. Since we do have these gifts, we should not hesitate to ask the same Holy Spirit to make His gifts more active in our lives.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: How do we know when we receive the Holy Spirit?

Answer: My brothers and I discovered something as we got older. There's a little bit of Dad in us. Each time we catch ourselves using one of his gestures, expressions, or comments about a meal, we say, "I'm getting more like Dad!" When we are confirmed, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no radical change in us that makes us seem suddenly different. Over a period of time we come to see that there is a little bit of the Spirit in us. We catch ourselves using the gifts, and often end up wondering where a bit of wisdom came from, why we were so patient, or we feel an intensity in our prayer. Perhaps we felt drawn to deepen our spiritual life or found courage in witnessing to our faith. That's when we know we have received the Holy Spirit. We take on his image. Yes, we grow in age, grace, and wisdom, but we also grow in our awareness and understanding of the working of God in our life-we realize we're getting more and more like God. Our thoughts, words, and actions carry that quality and others also see it in us. You might call it holiness. But be confident-there's a little bit of God in all of us!

MAY 21, 2017 6th SUNDAY OF EASTER

"If you love me you will keep my commandments." It's really as simple as that. We are only paying lip service to the Lord if we externally declare ourselves to be Christians but don't follow through on a life that confirms it.

In our modern culture, we often think of love as a feeling or a kind of devotion. It is thus all too common to separate love from appropriate action. Perhaps we reassure ourselves that we love Jesus because we believe that he is the Son of God and our personal Savior. But these thoughts--or even any grateful or pleasant feelings that come along with them--are not the fullest manifestation of real love. Rather, as Jesus tells us directly in today's Gospel, "Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me."

Now, for those of us who may be asking what exactly these commandments are, it's helpful to remember Jesus' response when he was questioned on the subject. "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is

ful to remember Jesus' response when he was questioned on the subject. "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37-39). These fundamental principles embrace everything that Jesus calls us to do. If we put God first and foremost in our lives, and if we treat our neighbors as we would wish to be treated, then all the rest falls into place. The Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, and any other fundamental Christian codes of behavior are all summed up here. Indeed, if we truly seek to love Jesus, putting him first and following his ways won't feel like a burden but rather like a beautiful blessing.
