

Gaius and Gracie - the Rectory Cats - Have a New Neighbor

About a month ago I received a call from Fr. Kuss, the Director of Pastoral Formation at the St. Paul Seminary, asking if Sacred Heart would be willing to host a seminarian this summer. Without hesitation, I agreed knowing you all to be warm and welcoming as well as familiar with seminarians who in years past had been assigned to Sacred Heart. I encourage you to invite him to your homes this summer for lunch or dinner, and time permitting, and your hospitality allowing perhaps you might even invite the pastor along at times. Fr. Kuss asked that we help him become better acquainted with American culture to assist him during these final years of study on the way to the Priesthood. This summer he will also learn how to drive. The seminary will be making those arrangements with professional driving instructors. Our seminarian is still in his first year of Major Seminary meaning that he has approximately four more years before he would be ordained a priest. He comes to us from Kabale, Uganda, and will be returning to Uganda to serve as a priest after his ordination. His name is Zephirino Tumwejunise which is pronounced Zef—i—ree-no Toom-weh-joo-nee-seh. He goes by "Zeph" for

short. I asked him to write up a short biography to serve as an initial introduction for you all.

A Short Biography of Zephirino Tumwejunise

Zephirino Tumwejunise is a seminarian from Rubanda Parish-Kabale Diocese, Uganda in Eastern Africa. Lake Victoria, the source of

the Nile river, is located in the southeastern part of Uganda. He was born in 1990 to Frederick B. and Cecelia N., who died shortly before he was sent to study Theology in the U.S.A. He is the second to last child in a family of eleven children. He has eight sisters and two brothers. He is the only child of the eleven who has had the opportunity for a formal Education because he comes from a peasant family. Having grown up in a such poor background, Zephirino started school when he was nine years old. The opportunity to go to school for primary, secondary, and postsecondary education is a great achievement for a person from humble circumstances. Before he entered primary, better known to us as elementary education, his parents gave him some responsibilities at home which included shepherding some of the family sheep and goats in the hills of Kabale. The distance from his home to school was considerable. It took Zephirino two and half hours to walk from home to school, which is among the reasons he did not begin until the age of nine. Prior to age nine he would not have been able to finish the walk. For seven years Zephirino faithfully walked those two and half hours since his primary education



lasted from 1999 to 2005. In his life Zephirino relates these seven years of walking with the seven sacraments of the church. Having been able to complete those seven years which was unheard of and unseen in his local community, Zephirino gives credit to God's grace. So, that he could thank God, and fulfill his dream, Zephirino joined the minor seminary. For him, the seminary has been an ideal home away from home where he has prayed and made numerous friends. He began his seminary life at St. Adrian's seminary from 2006 to 2009. Following this he advanced to high school at St. Paul's Seminary, Kabale from 2010 to 2011. From 2012 to 2015, he then joined Uganda Martyrs National Major Seminary, and acquired a degree in Philosophy. In 2015, having been installed as lector and acolyte, his Bishop appointed him for the pastoral spiritual year at St. Charles Lwanga Seminary to teach minor seminarians. Towards the end of 2016, his Bishop sent him to the U.S.A for theological studies at The St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity of the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. In the spring of 2017, he started his theology classes. Throughout his time in seminary during breaks and holidays, he has had the opportunity to serve in several parishes of Kabale Diocese. The experience he received from fellow Christians and the example of priests has strengthened his relationship and love for God.



GOSPEL MEDITATION Pentecost Sunday

"Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you." Then, he said it again. And then, "he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'" Jesus brings peace, and he brings the Holy Spirit. Peace, in fact, is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Today, on this feast of Pentecost, we remember the dramatic outpouring of the Holy Spirit that came upon those first apostles and the peace that came along with it. But we do more than remember. We also celebrate the presence of this same Spirit in our midst.

Through the sacrament of baptism, every Christian receives the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit in his or her soul. Thus, the gift of peace is already ours! The question is whether or not we have really begun to appreciate and utilize this most precious gift. Like the apostles who had locked themselves up "for fear of the Jews," we too are capable of imprisoning ourselves in our own anxieties. We fret and worry about the future, about our sufferings or our disappointments, and too often let these concerns stifle the true peace that Jesus offers us.

But the Church today urges us to rejoice and to step out in faith like the apostles who left their fears behind them. Peace not only alleviates our fears, it also frees us to live our faith to the fullest, to have the courage to take risks, and to leave our comfort zone for the sake of the Gospel. This is what we are called and, not only that, empowered to do. Anything less is a kind of spiritual poverty we bring upon ourselves. God has given us the gift of himself, present and available in every moment, every place, and every situation. May we recognize this most wonderful gift and give thanks with grateful hearts.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: Is it true that the feast of Pentecost, the celebration of the descent of the Spirit upon the followers of Jesus, was a Jewish pilgrimage festival?

Answer: Pentecost is only mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles, written by the author of Luke's Gospel. John's Gospel speaks of Jesus breathing the Spirit upon his followers on Easter Sunday. Luke in Acts is the only one who unpacks the Easter events of Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, ascension, and the sending forth of the Spirit in a period of fifty days.

The Jews had three pilgrimage feasts--Passover, celebrating the Exodus from Egypt; Shavuot, or festival of Weeks, celebrating the giving of the law on Mount Sinai; and Sukkot, the harvest festival of Booths, commemorating the forty years of wandering in the desert. Shavuot celebrated the central covenant event in Jewish life--the giving of the law to Moses on Mount Sinai. The mighty wind, the shaking of the house in which the followers were gathered, along with the tongues of fire all reflect elements surrounding the giving of the law to Moses in the Book of Exodus. Luke was imaging this very backdrop and scenario in this significant event of the community being gifted with the Spirit. As the Torah was the way to God for Jews, so Jesus' Spirit was the guide, power, and path to God for his followers.


