From the Heart

On December 26th the day after Christmas fellow parishioners Daniel and Diane Jaimes and their children, Victoria, Anastasia, and Joseph suffered a devastating fire in their home, which began in the garage and spread to their attached home. Much of their property and personal effects are lost. They are all safe, though sadly they did lose Domino, their cat. Their home is not a total loss, but they will be engaged in repairing and rebuilding their home over the next four to six months, and possibly longer. While insurance will cover some items, the Jaimes family will need financial assistance to replace items that insurance will not fully cover, such as their 13-year-old and 16-year-old cars that were destroyed in the fire. This leaves them with no transportation for the family to meet their daily needs. Additional funds are needed to help cover interim costs such as clothes, toys, personal care items, rebuilding, etc.

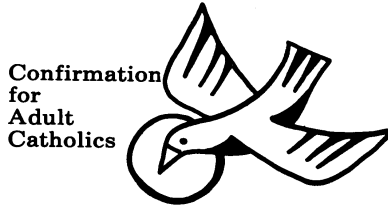
Bishop Robert Barron's Catholicism — The Pivotal players
