(A Little Levity for You)****Written on Monday January 23rd, 2017**

At the start of the 4th Quarter of the happy Packer debacle (happy for me at least), I heard strange noises coming from the main floor. As I went to the library it dashed back up the stairs. I quickly closed the door to the library and went upstairs to the entry vestibule where the squirrel was hiding behind a box in the corner. Capital Campaign Redemption Phase

Year 3 Update #1 – 4th Qtr. Report

Here is the fourteenth overall update corresponding with the conclusion of the 4th quarter of calendar year 2016 on where we are at vis-à-vis our capital campaign redemption phase. Our focus at this time is retiring debt from phase I. During the 4th quarter of 2016 we retired an additional **\$39,336** from our long term debt taken on as a result of our 2012 building project. Our balance on the long term loan as of the end of the 4th Quarter, December 31st, 2016 is **\$299,748**. We are now entering the final year of the redemption phase in 2017.
