

Lent: The Campaign of Christian Service

On Ash Wednesday the Collect, or opening prayer of the Mass describes the season of Lent as a "Campaign of Christian Service" whereby "we take up battle against spiritual evils." The military language reminds us that life is not without its challenges and trials. The biggest challenge we face is the image in the mirror that stares back at us each day. The battle we wage is against our own selfish desires and interests. How best can we use of the "weapons of self-restraint?"

The first weapon of self-restraint is fasting which is a kind of penance. Fasting or limiting the amount of food we take in a given day is the first context of this spiritual discipline, but I encourage you to think about fasting in a wider sense. Who are the people, where are the places, and what are the things that excessive attachment crowds out room for God in our mind and heart? Performing some kind of penance by limiting or saying "no" to good things we enjoy makes more room for God and His ways. Our goal here is to train ourselves to say "no" in little things so that we can say "no" to the big temptations we face in life. Saying no, even to good things we enjoy, like chocolate, can build up our will. This is where giving up something good in Lent, that we will enjoy later, promotes holiness of life.

The second weapon of self-restraint is abstinence. On Ash Wednesday and throughout the Fridays of Lent we abstain from meat. Abstinence can also be applied to other areas of life where we want to make a voluntary amendment of life, or change in how we live. Here we give up those things that need to go sooner or later, our bad habits. Our goal here is to learn to love our souls more than our bodies. In Lent we can break a bad habit forever. Some examples include: drinking alcohol while alone, taking mind altering drugs to escape from the challenges of life, viewing pornography, sinning with one self, smoking, gambling, gossiping, surfing the web without real need, watching TV shows which promote immorality or non-Christian world views, eating between meals, complaining, saying vulgar words, having recourse to astrology, horoscopes and psychics, or not getting up on time.

Yet another prayer and image from Ash Wednesday comes from the Prayer over the Gifts. We prayed to God "that, through works of penance and charity we may turn away from harmful pleasures....and, cleansed from our sins, may become worthy to celebrate devoutly the Passion of your Son." Works of charity, doing good deeds or making a special gift of our time or treasure is yet another aspect of Lent. Our goal is to strengthen our relationship with Jesus and His Church. Perhaps it is volunteering for the parish Fish Fry. Perhaps is taking time to write a letter to someone in prison, or volunteering at a nursing home, or at the NEAR Food shelf, or volunteering to work with students struggling to learn at school, or driving meals to neighbors. When it comes to charity we should look There are many works of charity we can choose to do in Lent.

Prayer, going to Mass daily, or on the Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent, or on Saturday morning in addition to Sunday, going to the Stations of the Cross, making it a priority to read Scripture daily, perhaps reading one of the four Gospels, are some ideas. Making time to go to confession during Lent, making time for 10 to 15 minutes of mental prayer, doing some kind of spiritual reading is still another way to enter into the Holy Season of Lent. I am sure you can find many more ideas. Let us pray for each other that we take advantage of the Holy Season of Lent and persevere in the good God is going in our lives.
