The Power to Face the Fear of Death

“Death’s mightiest pow’rs have done their worst, And Jesus has his foes dispersed; Let shouts of praise and joy outburst: Alleluia!”

This hymn text comes from 12th century. It reminds us that death has long been personified both in the imagination, but also in literature and in culture. Who of us could say we have no understanding, nor images of the

Grim Reaper in our minds? This image is presented to us as something to be feared. St. Francis of Assisi, however, referred to death as “Sister Death.” To treat the reality of death in a familial sense would not be possible except for the Resurrection of Jesus. Not only did St. Francis believe in the Resurrection, it also taught him that the death of the body, even when death comes cannot prevail over life. Yes, “Death’s mightiest pow’rs have done their worst,” but death cannot conquer the author of life. The Resurrection of Jesus taught St. Francis that ‘Death’ was not to be feared. That does not mean that fear of death was absent in the life of St. Francis. Faith and hope in the Resurrection of Jesus gave him the capacity to embrace death as it came to him. It was Easter faith that gave him the power to face down the fear of death. In the end St. Francis so wanted to imitate Jesus that he would even come to welcome death. When death would come for his body, he knew he would be one step closer to seeing the full glory of the Lord. In addition, he had the firm and lasting hope that even his body, like that of the body of Jesus, would be resurrected on the last day and joined together with his soul once again.

Most all of us fear bodily death. Each year as we age we come closer and closer to this reality. Faith in the Resurrection of Jesus has the capacity to deliver us from the fear of bodily death. Faith and hope in the Resurrection equips us to face that fear with confidence. In his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, as Jesus prayed to the Father, even our Lord asked if it might be possible to let the chalice of suffering pass from him. “Not my will, but thine be done”, he says. Even our Lord in his humanity feared death. We must all make the great act of faith as we come face to face with the reality of meeting death. The human nature of Jesus does precisely this as he entrusts himself to the Heavenly Father.

Fear of death might be a remote experience when we are young and healthy. It will come closer to us due to life circumstances. In the end, it will be our Easter faith that will give us the strength we need to face the fear of death, and overcome it. I pray Easter faith will accompany you now, and grow stronger in your heart every Sunday, and every Easter.
