

From the Heart

Linens and Things

Last week I included information about the "vesperale" a dust cover placed over the altar linens to protect those lines outside of Mass. Let me take a step back and speak this week about the altar and the linens which adorn the altar. Traditionally, the altar, made of stone, granite, or marble and in the United States an exception allows some kinds of wood to be used, represents Christ "the supernatural rock". By definition, an altar is a place of sacrifice. The Christian altar represents Christ as one of the Easter prefaces makes clear when it notes that Jesus is the priest, the altar, and the lamb of sacrifice. As High priest, He offers his body and blood as the acceptable sacrifice, the spotless and unblemished lamb resting upon the cross the altar of sac-


rifice. The altar crucifix standing near or preferably on the altar especially reminds us of this reality. Other signs of reverence utilized include bowing before the altar as we pass by it, just as we are called to genuflect before the tabernacle containing the Holy Eucharist as we pass by it. At the beginning and end of Mass that altar is likewise greeted with a ceremonial kiss by the sacred ministers. On Good Friday, the sacred ministers even prostrate themselves, or lie face down on the ground before the altar for a time as an act of worship to show profound respect for the sacrality of the altar. Since the altar is a symbol of Christ, the sacred altar linens and the antependium, or altar frontal, are likened to the vesture of Christ. The altar linens also represent the burial linens which wrapped the dead body of Jesus. That they have come to share this meaning is fitting since the altar is often made to resemble a sepulcher or tomb. From the tomb our Lord rises to new life. In the liturgy, the giving of His sacred body and blood to the flock also symbolizes the Resurrection pledge for believers since in a certain sense after receiving the Holy Eucharist worthily believers receive life itself. There are three altar linens with one additional waxed linen known as the cerecloth which is meant to rest between the altar and the other three. Having so many linens protects the altar from being permanently stained from wine in the event of a spill. Below a diagram explains the various linens and how they are meant to be arranged upon the Christian altar.

<u>Cloth 1</u> is known as a "cerecloth", a linen cloth specially treated with wax that is first used just after the altar is consecrated with the Sacred Chrism.

<u>Cloth 2</u> is a plain linen cloth which covers the "table" of the altar.

<u>Cloth 3</u> is a second linen cloth laying on top of both the "cerecloth" and the first linen cloth.

<u>Cloth 4</u> is a third and final linen cloth that covers the table of the altar and hangs down to the ground on both sides.


