

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK



Forgiving someone does not mean that we necessarily tolerate or condone their behavior. Rather, it has to do with letting go of the anger and the hurt that really is more self-destructive than productive. We are called to recognize the brokenness and sinfulness of each other. We may, at times, have to walk away from an abusive or destructive relationship. However, keeping in mind the lessons it taught, we can free ourselves from its hurtful grasp by learning how to forgive as God forgives. It's a tall order.

Annual KC Pro-Life Prayer Vigil

The annual pro-life prayer vigil, sponsored by the St Vincent de Paul Knights of Columbus, Council 9139, is scheduled for Saturday, September 30, 2017 at the Robbins-dale (Abortion) Clinic, P.A. The clinic is located at 3819 West Broadway, Minneapolis MN 55422. Per the Minnesota Department of Health *the clinic performed 929 abortions in 2016 or <u>5 abortions every business day.</u>*

Numbers from the 2017 Lenten 40 Days for Life – held at 341 locations in 30 countries with 100,000 participants and 4,700 churches. The effort saved 637 lives from abortion; 13 abortion workers quit their jobs; 9 abortion facilities were closed.






