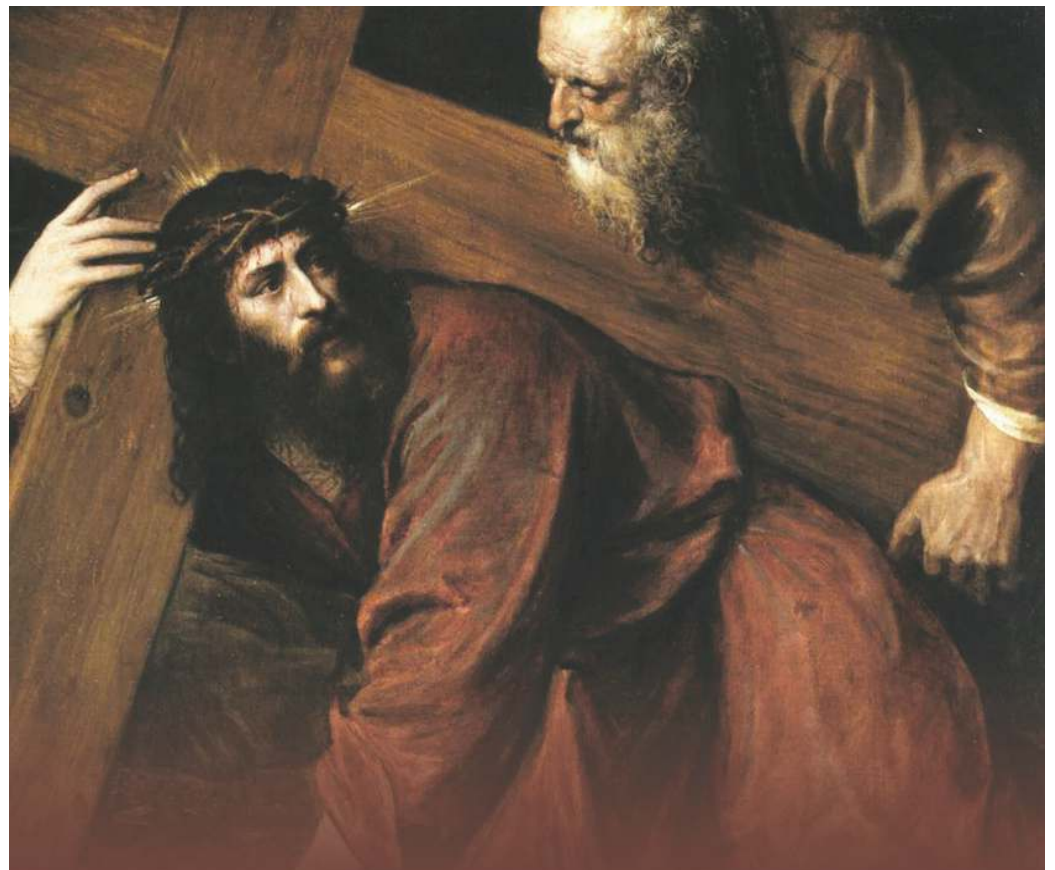

Prayers Answered – written on August 29th, 2017

Just over a month ago, I asked the people of the parish to pray for a new Business Administrator for Sacred Heart Catholic Church and School. Our Parish Business Administrator Emeritus, Rollie Brouillard, retired at the end of April. Our search committee, which consisted of Deacon Dennis Hanson of Holy Name Parish, Deacon Jim Ramsey, our assigned deacon and a former trustee of the parish, and our current lay trustees, Art Zenzen and Mary Daugherty, have been working since the end of March with a thorough process so we could hire the right Parish Business Administrator for our needs in 2017. We interviewed many candidates. Each candidate brought various gifts and skills to offer Sacred Heart. Finding the right combination of skills with our current needs was one of the chief goals of our search committee.

The role of the Parish Business Administrator in a medium sized Catholic Parish operating its own school requires a portfolio of many divergent skills. Our position requires strong management skills, financial skills in accounting, analysis, and planning. It requires excellent communication skills especially considering the multiple mediums used by our multi-generational community. Each generation has their own expectations and needs in regard to effective communication. Our position requires expertise in human resources and personnel development as well as knowledge of buildings and their proper care and maintenance. It requires an understanding of the mission of Catholic Church in the world and the value that Catholic Education brings to a community. It requires an understanding of the vital importance of ongoing ministries and apostolates and the need to continually revitalize them in order to carry out the mission of the Church. It requires a person with the ability to grow and learn, and the ability to bring about that growth and development in colleagues and coworkers. Our Parish Business Administrator above all requires leadership and organizational skills that will enable the integration of their portfolio of skills into a cohesive whole for the benefit of Sacred Heart and our local community.

On two occasions, we were very close to making a job offer, but each time before the offer was made something stood in the way. It can be demoralizing to be at the cusp and then see it fall through for various reasons. Nevertheless, due diligence requires a thorough process, and trustful surrender to God's Providence requires patience and hope that the Lord sends the right person at the right time.

I am most grateful for the time and counsel offered by all on the search committee, and am happy to announce that our new parish business administrator will be Mary Daugherty.

As a parishioner for 22 years, and a trustee for the last 10 ½ years, Mary is committed to Sacred Heart Church and School. I have depended upon her counsel for many years now, and look forward to her vision and leadership skills being exercised each working day for the betterment of Sacred Heart and her many ministries and apostolates. As a co-chair of the board of directors of an area Catholic High School she is committed to the mission and idea of Catholic Education for the raising of saints and the forming of faithful citizens. She has worked for many years in the corporate world with large scale organizations as well as in small business world with small scale organizations thus bringing a wealth of experience and knowledge to draw from. Mary is a graduate of the University of St. Thomas – a plus if you're a Thommie like me – at both the undergraduate level, and the graduate level holding a Master's Degree in Business Administration. It has taken us a period of four months since Rollie's retirement to reach this point. I can only tell you how excited I am for Mary to be taking on this new role. I am likewise grateful to you for your continued prayers, and to God for His Divine Providence working out in surprising and unexpected ways. Mary Daugherty will begin her new position as our Parish Business Administrator on September 25th, 2017, and will have been introduced to our entire staff on Friday September 1st. We have also hired a new Maintenance Supervisor named Mark Eldridge who will be starting on September 5th, 2017 the first day of our new School Year. I will introduce him to you with more detail in next week's bulletin.

A School of Excellence

Sacred Heart Catholic School ensures that we are a school of excellence by seeking certification from outside organizations. During this past year, our Pre K Program was re-accredited through the National Association for the Education of Young Children and received a 4-Star rating thru Parent Aware. This coming school year, we are seeking re-accreditation through the Minnesota Nonpublic School Accrediting Association for the K-8 program. Each process has strict guidelines to follow in order to be certified, confirming Sacred Heart Catholic School as a school of excellence.

School Goals for 2017-2018

- ✦ Complete and update curriculum maps for all grades/subjects to align curriculum with state standards.
- ✦ Implement new math curriculum for grades K-8 by providing professional development, grade level meetings, and creating a protocol of math guidelines for all grades.
- ✦ Implement "Defined Stem" integrated lessons across all grade levels.
- ✦ Provide further professional development for teachers on how to use NWEA reports to guide group and individualized instruction in the classroom.
- ✦ Revise our current marketing plan for Pre-K and K-8 program to retain, recruit and increase community awareness.
- ✦ Plan and implement a new fundraising revenue stream to supplement the school budget in the amount of \$10,000.
- ✦ Create a 3 year plan for our C-STEM program to ensure success of our new initiative.
- ✦ Increase Pre-K awareness of new branding "Faithful Beginnings" and increase Pre-K to kinder retention.
- ✦ Complete MNSAA Self-Study along with a new strategic plan for 2018-2024.
- ✦ Finalize new school mission statement and philosophy.
- ✦ Create a 3 year plan for our Outdoor Learning space on school grounds. Complete year 1 during the 2017-2018 school year.
- ✦ Install new carpet in grades 1-4.
- ✦ Purchase new student desks/chairs for grades 1-5 along with flexible seating options for all grades.
- ✦ Implement a new classroom management plan using EnVoy for grades K-4.
- ✦ Provide staff training focusing on "Creating a Positive School Culture" using Top20Training.

Purchase and implement the "Great Escape Classroom Workshop" to promote problem solving skills for STEM.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

As we celebrate Labor Day, can you tell me about Catholic teaching regarding labor?

Answer:

One of the most important principles of Catholic social teaching is the dignity of work and the rights of workers. Four encyclicals address this foundational social teaching: "Rerum Novarum" (1891) by Leo XIII, "Quadragesimo Anno" (1931) by Pius XI, "Laborem Exercens" (1981) and "Centesimus Annus" (1991) by John Paul II. They address both the theology and dignity of work. In Genesis, God takes the initiative in creating the world, calling forth human beings to be faithful stewards of creation. From this perspective, work can be spiritually understood in terms of sharing in God's ongoing activity to build, create, and transform the world. Human beings are co-creators with God. This vocation demands self-discipline.

Besides an exercise in self-discipline, work is also the means by which we develop and fulfill ourselves. In work, we shape the world and our environment. Through work, we also shape ourselves. Pope John Paul II summarized this point in "Laborem Exercens," "The value of human work is not primarily the kind of work being done but the fact that the one who is doing it is a person" (#6). Labor Day offers an excellent opportunity to reflect on how we view work in light of our Catholic social teaching.
