

Jesus is Lord, Christ is King!

Written on Monday, November 20th, 2017



This final Sunday after Pentecost, and last Sunday before the start of Advent and the new liturgical year we celebrate **The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.** The sacred scriptures attest that Jesus in Lord, that Christ is King, in several places.

St. Luke: "For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is **Christ and Lord**." Lk 2:11

St. Paul: "Because of this, God greatly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under

the earth, and every tongue confess that **Jesus Christ is Lord**, to the glory of God the Father." Phil. 2:9-11

St. John: "They will fight with the Lamb, (N.B. here 'They' refer to followers of the 'Beast,' aka Satan), but the Lamb (N.B. the 'Lamb' is Jesus), will conquer them, for He is Lord of lords and king of kings, and those with Him are called, chosen, and faithful." Rv. 17:14

And my favorite in St. Peter's letter: "But sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope." 1 Pt. 3:15

To truly be King of the Universe Jesus must be lord of every part of our heart. This is precisely the challenge each one of us faces, since at times our human will chooses to rebel against our reason, and desires to be Lord alone. It is one of the false idols of our day, the equating of freedom with autonomy - "freedom from," rather than "freedom for." Catholic theology calls it Original Sin. Baptism brings the soul forgiveness of sin, but does not remove all its effects.

The psalmist points out the way writing: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; understanding marks all who attain it. His praise endures forever!" Ps. 111:10. Living filial "Fear of the LORD," making Jesus Lord, and King of our whole heart, I find to be a process, and the work of a lifetime, but this sanctification is how saints are made. When Robert Frost wrote: "And miles to go before I sleep, And miles to go before I sleep," perhaps he was referring to this work.

To watch his woods fill up with snow.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

One day when I was walking the city streets where I was giving a series of talks, I saw what appeared to be an older woman hunched over with a sign asking for help. At first I passed her, on my way to visit the local drugstore. But then I came back around when I realized that I had not been very mindful upon first seeing her. I didn't have much cash to give her, but as I always tell everyone else in my talks, oftentimes what people need more than cash is someone to at least acknowledge them. I reached into my pocket to give her what little I had and I simply said, "Hello. I hope you are okay and I hope you can use this." When her face turned toward me I saw she was probably only about sixteen years of age and she was very beautiful. She smiled immediately and said how much this meant to her. She gathered up her few belongings and I watched her walk to a café for a meal. I turned to walk back to my lodging and I thought to myself, "She could have been my daughter." That's when the still, small voice spoke to me saying, "Don't you understand? That was your daughter!"

Who is your daughter or son, your mother or father? Who is your neighbor? Better yet, in whom do you see Jesus? A young homeless girl on the street can take on so many forms: stranger, neighbor, daughter, and Jesus. Unless we are mindful of those in our midst, we miss the chance to see any of them. We must never be fooled by appearance. That day I almost missed seeing my Lord.
