

The Year of the Lord 2018 Written on Friday, December 22, 2017

Even though academia, popular culture, and other contemporary actors have tried to supplant or replace Christian references and terminology through the use of terms such as B.C.E. (Before the Common Era) and C.E. (Common Era) nevertheless that something which radically changed the history of the world happened some 2018 years ago can not be denied. Jesus, the savior of Nations, Son of God and son of man, the Word made Flesh, Emmanuel, that is God-with-us, was born

into the world, and the world has never been the same. "Christ is at the center, Christ is the center. Christ is the center of creation, Christ is the center of his people and Christ is the center of history." These words preached by Pope Francis back in 2013 echo this foundational principle.

The term B.C. was used in the anglo world to identify history before the birth of Christ, while the term A.D., which does NOT mean "After Death" as many mistakenly think, identifes history since the entrance of the Lord Jesus into the world. What then does A.D. actually mean? The term is an abbreviation for the Latin phrase *Anno Domini* which means "The Year of the Lord." Using the initials A.D. is a way for us to embrace what Pope Francis preached back in 2013, namely, that Jesus Christ is the center of history. Even with secular culture and academia seeking to replace and supplant Christian references I have always found it ironic that those providing these so called replacement terms came up with B.C.E. and C.E. since they can so easily be taken to mean "Before the Christian Era." Regardless of what academia, or pop culture is doing, I have no problems wishing you all a happy new year as we enter the Year of the Lord 2018.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

December 31, 2017 The Holy Family

"When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned ... to their own town of Nazareth." Mary and Joseph were faithful Jews who followed the norms of their religion. Today's Gospel describes the event we call "The Presentation." Jesus' parents, like every Jewish family, presented their infant son to the Lord in a formal ceremony at the temple in Jerusalem. Having done what their religious rites required (and having heard the prophetic words of Simeon and Anna), Mary and Joseph returned home. It was back in their native region of Galilee, amidst the daily routine of domestic life, that Jesus "grew and became strong, filled with wisdom."

As Christians, we too consecrate our children to the Lord when we have them baptized in the Church. Seeing our children receive this sacrament of initiation is always a moment of great joy and hope as we anticipate the life that lies ahead for them, both on earth and in eternity. But the baptism of a baby is only the beginning of this journey towards heaven. In truth, the little daily details, the simple living of family life in our own home paves the way for our children to reach their eternal home.

And so it was with the Holy Family. Jesus' childhood, his formation and development took place not primarily amidst the public drama of the temple, but in the quiet privacy of his home. How important this home was, where his parents raised him in their faith and helped him live in such a way that "the favor of God was upon him." May we too, in our homes and our families, remember that although our mission may be lived out in very small moments, taken together they have an eternal significance.



STARTING IN JANUARY*****

DAVID IS THE PARADIGMATIC KING IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

His kingship recalls that of Adam in the Garden of Eden, and yet it points toward the King par excellence, Jesus Christ. Adam was the first king and steward of the rightly ordered Garden of Eden. He was called to govern the garden according to God's mind and purpose, but by allowing negative influences to wreak havoc on Eden, he did not fulfill his kingly responsibility. Long after Adam, David emerged as the definitive king who would restore order in the Garden and bring the world under the lordship of God. But like Adam, David fell, and his reign ushered in a succession of compromised kings and rejected prophets.

The New Testament, however, foretold a son of David who would realize the fullness of Israelite kingship...but whose actual reign defied expectation.

King David causes us to look back toward Adam's kingship and forward toward Christ the King, seeing Christ as the fulfillment of the Davidic line and the realization of the Kingdom of God on earth. In *David the King*, Bishop Barron helps us to understand this pivotal figure in light of the first king and the King of kings.


EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP -RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS Everyday Stewardship
