The Philadelphia Massacre Written on Wednesday, January 24, 2018

This January so many of us have been following the NFL Playoffs especially since our hometown team had a realistic opportunity of being the first home town team to reach the Super Bowl. With Super Bowl LII just around the corner Minnesota will be inundated with visitors from across the country and from around the globe. Alas the Minnesota Vikings returned to form and lost to the Philadelphia Eagles 38-7 in a game that echoed another epic NFC Championship to the New York Giants referred to as 41 – donut.

The Minneapolis Miracle and last second touchdown connection between Vikings Quarterback Case Keenum and wide-receiver Stefon Diggs to beat the New Orleans Saints on January 14 excited a long weary fan base, and made so many of us true believers that our Vikings could go all the way to the Super Bowl, and win. Alas, "The Minneapolis Miracle" turned into "The Philadelphia Massacre," a truly epic fail by our beloved Minnesota Vikings. Cheese heads everywhere must be celebrating. Grrr.. I call the massacre an epic fail because the NFL's number one defense is not supposed to give up 38 points to anyone. When the 2001 Vikings went to New York back in 2001 they were not expected to win. The 2018 Vikings were expected to win. How did it all go so wrong? It is clear to me we were outplayed and outcoached. In some respects, the portent for this loss had occurred earlier in the season in the loss we had against the Pittsburgh Steelers when we lost 26-9. I thought it was their physical play, and ability to win the battle at the line of scrimmage that exposed the weaknesses of the Minnesota Vikings.

After the Philadelphia Massacre as I drove back to Robbinsdale from my brother's house in Hastings I wondered if I would even watch Super Bowl LII. At Mass on January 21st we heard the following words from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians we heard the following:

I tell you, brothers and sisters, the time is running out.

From now on, let those having wives act as not having them,

those weeping as not weeping,

those rejoicing as not rejoicing,

those buying as not owning,

those using the world as not using it fully.

For the world in its present form is passing away.

At the 10:00 a.m. Mass I noted at the very beginning of my homily that us Vikings fans who have been rejoicing because of the Minneapolis Miracle needed to approach the NFC Championship game before it occurred "as not rejoicing." I noted that St. Paul was trying to teach the Corinthians the importance of detachment as they conduct their affairs. Then I pondered, "how many Miracles can you have in one playoff run," then I said in these or similar words "but if the Vikings do win in Philadelphia, then 'the world in its present form is passing away." There are many times when we priests and preachers are really preaching to ourselves. On January 21st in commenting on the importance of detachment I was preaching to myself as much as to you. So now I must ask the question of whether I will watch Super Bowl LII? I wonder how best to work on detachment. To watch or not to watch that is the question.

Adam was the first king and steward of the rightly ordered Garden of Eden. He was called to govern the garden, but by allowing negative influences to wreak havoc on Edan, he did not fulfill his kingly responsibility. Long after Adam, David emerged as the definitive king who would restore order in the Garden and

bring the world under the lordship of God. But like Adam, David fell, and his reign ushered in a succession of compromised kings and rejected prophets. The Scriptures, however, foretold a son of David who would realize the fullness of Israelite kingship...but whose actual reign defined expectation.

In David the King, Bishop Barron helps us to understand this pivotal figure in light of the first king and the King of kings.
