

#### <u>From the Pastor — written on February 7, 2018</u>



#### <u>Lent</u>

As you read this we are closing in on the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent. Ash Wednesday falls on February 14<sup>th</sup> this year. So if Valentine's day is usually a day of penance for you your in luck! Of course the purpose of Lent is preparation for Easter. We are given three primary ways to prepare for Easter during Lent – Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving (Charitable Works). Lent involves our whole person – the discipline of the body is a pathway for spiritual growth. St. Theresa of Avila, the 16<sup>th</sup> century reformer in Spain of Catholic Carmelite nuns once said: "Our body has this defect that, the more it is provided care and comforts, the more needs and desires it finds." Of course what we think we need and what we actually need to flourish can be two very distinct things. Second, newly found desires usually don't lead us to God, but often away from him. In light of St. Theresa's wisdom we can look at the season of lent and the discipline of Lent with new eyes. Lenten discipline, especially fasting and abstinence be-

comes an opportunity to eliminate falsely perceived needs, and alter desires that lead us away from God.

Dr. Pius Parsch, a German priest and theologian active in the Liturgical Movement of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century compares the discipline of Lent to spring cleaning when he writes:

"Now we can understand why the church has at heart to cleanse herself from the filth that adheres to her garment from the sins of Christians. The soap, the lye and the broom used by the church for this cleansing process is fasting. The dust and dirt accumulated over winter have to be routed. Outside in the gardens, now at the coming of spring, leaves and dry grass have to be raked together and burned. Now in the time of Lent, Mother Church, too, like the housewife and the gardener, is determined to burn up and to rout the dust and trash of our sins. The means she employs are fasting, mortification, abstinence and self-conquest."

With Ash Wednesday around the corner now is the time to make decisions about how to embrace the season of Lent. In making preparation we need to look to all three areas of Lenten practice. The first is prayer – some people will pray the rosary every day during lent, other will come to daily Mass during lent, others will choose to read one of the Gospels during lent. Participate in Bible Study – there is an ongoing study of King David on Tuesdays you might consider, talk to Bunny for more information, it is not to late to join. Any and all of these practices are helpful for growing in prayer. The most important thing we give to God is our time. The second is fasting and abstinence – during the Fridays of Lent we abstain from meat. The same holds true for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday these are required days of abstinence from meat. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also required days of fasting, meaning we should only eat one full meal on this day. We can take a couple snacks or petite meals on these days provided it does not equal a full meal. Of course these are minimal expectations. For those who have completed their 60<sup>th</sup> year the law no longer requires you to fast, nevertheless if you can do this without jeopardizing your health, then fast. We can always do more, and some will fast every day of Lent save Sundays. Or they will follow the ancient practice of fasting on all Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent. There are other ways we can fast. How about fasting on Fridays from your smartphone, the internet, or from Facebook, or from texting, or from chocolate? I would encourage young people especially to look at the area of media and technology as areas where they can enact Lenten discipline. The third practice is almsgiving – this practice means supporting charitable works and actions through our resources and time. For inspiration in area we can look to the corporal and spiritual works of mercy and strive to put them into action.

We are called to all three areas. Let us observe our Lent mindful of all three areas. Making the commitment to pray more, making the commitment to fast from something, and making the commitment to live generously are all paths to a stronger relationship with Jesus. As we make these commitments let us remember not to boast, or to announce what we are doing for the purpose of impressing someone. If Lent is to be a true preparation for Easter, our commitments must be from our hearts.




