

<u>Formed</u>

From the Heart

A couple weeks back in my homily I referred to the famous conversion of Saul of Tarsus, who prior to his conversion was an active persecutor of the early Christians, all of whom were Jews. Saul is better known to us as St. Paul, the Apostle. On his way to Damascus to continue that persecution of "the Way" he had an experience of the risen Lord. It is described in the ninth chapter of <u>the Acts of the Apostles</u> like this:

"Now Saul, still breathing murderous threats against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest ² and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, that, if he should find any men or women who belonged to the Way, ^[b] he might bring them back to Jerusalem in chains. ³ On his journey, as he was nearing Damascus, a light from the sky suddenly flashed around him. ⁴ He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul,

why are you persecuting me?" ⁵ He said, "Who are you, sir?" The reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. ⁶ Now get up and go into the city and you will be told what you must do."

After Saul's conversion in about the year 34 A.D. he went to Arabia for a period of three years. During this time, he was being formed in the faith in which he had received baptism. After three years he returns to Damascus to preach to fellow Jews that Jesus was Lord and Messiah. After having some difficulties in Damascus, he and St. Barnabas, another disciple who was one of those who took the lead in forming St. Paul went up to Jerusalem to confer with the Cephas, better known to us as Peter, and other leading apostles of the Church in Jerusalem. During this time of consultation St. Paul was preaching and giving testimony to the Hellenists. In **the Acts of the Apostles** "Hellenists" are Greek Speaking Jews. According to **Acts 9:23-30** his words were not received well. In fact, St. Luke writes that:

"After a long time had passed, the Jews [of Damascus] conspired to kill him, ²⁴ but their plot became known to Saul. Now they were keeping watch on the gates day and night so as to kill him, ²⁵ but his disciples took him one night and let him down through an opening in the wall, lowering him in a basket. ²⁶ When he arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. ²⁷ Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how on the way he had seen the Lord and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. ²⁸ He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. ²⁹ He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. ³⁰ And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus."

St. Paul would spend ten years in Tarsus, where his formation in the faith, and as a preacher of the faith would continue to be honed. It was in the years 46 and 47 A.D. that St. Paul's missionary work began in earnest, a full twelve years after he first experienced the Risen Lord, and had his famous conversion.

The biography of the great Apostle of the Gentiles is a reminder to us of the importance of formation in the Faith. We all need formation, even as adults, just like St. Paul, and will continue to require formation in knowing, living, and spreading the faith. A great tool for this is a new Website and App from the **AUGUSTINE INSTITUTE** called **FORMED**. This new resource is like Netflix for Catholics having all kinds of excellent content on our faith including Movies on Saints, Docudramas, Audio Podcasts from inspiring speakers, eBooks, Bible Studies, other dynamic presentations, and so much more. Thanks to a generous donor **FORMED is now available to you as a gift from Sacred Heart.** All you need to do is go to the following website: SHRMN.FORMED.ORG and register.

Register with your email address, pick a password (remember to save it in your browser, or write it down) and begin to enjoy great Catholic content. 
