

# From the Heart

# The Southern Border

The news has been filled with stories about the southern border and the waves of immigrants seeking to enter our country, even illegally. According to current immigration law, and a court ruling known as the "Flores Decision" when immigrants cross the border illegally, and are prosecuted, either the adult facing prosecution and possible deportation is held in custody until such time as an immigration judge hears their asylum request, or the adult is released. Once released the adult is required by law to attend a hearing for their asylum request at a later date, in the meantime they have often been released and became free to enter into the coun-

try. Many of those who have been released in the past have not shown up for their court hearing. In the past both the Obama Administration and Bush Administration while enforcing immigration laws had detained some adults who had entered the country illegally, and because of the "Flores Decision" have separated parents from children. The "Flores Decision" does not allow the children of parents kept in custody to be held longer than 21 days, which means that, while their detained parents await their hearing, either their children are sent to live with relatives already living in the United States, or held in another facility separate from their parents. I don't recall moral outrage being expressed in the past for this policy which even former Administrations have used. If children had been separated in the past from their parents in former administrations why is the furor so great now? One of the reasons for the furor now is the zero-tolerance policy of the Trump Administration, meaning that instead of selectively enforcing immigration laws as had been done in former Administrations leading to a policy some have called "catch and release" for certain groupings of illegal immigrants the Trump Administration is seeking to apply existing laws to "all" immigrants who cross the border illegally, which means the number of family separations has been on the increase. In view of this furor the Trump Administration issued an executive action ending the policy of family separations, however, the Trump Administration is still seeking to detain all immigrants caught crossing the border illegally, the only change now, is that the adults and children will be detained together while the same adults await their asylum hearing from an immigration judge. The executive action will no doubt be litigated in the courts. Some argue it is illegal since it violates the "Flores Decision." What is clear in all of this is that the country has reached a crossroads regarding immigration.

Archbishop Hebda recently issued a statement regarding this issue that is worth reading. With concise language in this statement the Archbishop covers all the bases, articulating well the general principles of the social teachings of the Catholic Church. The disagreements when attempting to apply them. Call me cynical, but I doubt both sides of the aisle will be able to come together to meet what our Archbishop is calling for, so beseeching the Lord in prayer is always appropriate.

# **Statement Regarding Separation of Families at Border**

I am pleased President Trump has committed to executive action to end the family separations happening at the U.S.-Mexico border. The Catholic Church has always promoted and defended the dignity of every human person and the rights of families to care for their children. The Church has also always affirmed a country's duty to secure its borders and protect its citizens while welcoming those fleeing oppression, violence and poverty. Pope Francis reminded us on Twitter this morning that "We encounter Jesus in those who are poor, rejected, or refugees. Do not let fear get in the way of welcoming our neighbor in need." I encourage all people of good will to continue to pray for and contact their elected officials and urge them to uphold the laws of this country, work for comprehensive immigration reform, and respect life at all stages.
