Dear Parishioners,

Hopefully many of you have had the opportunity to watch our Parish Wide Study Program “Presence.’ either in your home or joining us at Sacred heart for the scheduled presentation last weekend after the weekend Masses.

The Following is from the downloadable Study guide on the First Session.....

When is the last time you sat down to enjoy a meal with your family or close friends—not just to eat food in close proximity to each other, but to bask in each other’s presence and grow in love for one another? For most of us, this doesn’t happen at a typical meal. But this is the kind of meal God wants to share with us. This is the kind of meal he has prepared for us and invited us to participate in through the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Scripture tells us that God is love (see 1 John 4:8). Everything that he does is out of love and expresses love. He created us out of love, and he died on the Cross to redeem us so that we could share in his love. God continues to invite us into a deeper experience of his perfect love in the Eucharist. He wants to unite us to himself, to pour his love into us and to receive our love. Under the appearance of simple bread and wine, God is truly and completely present with us.

What is your favorite way to enjoy the presence of your family or close friends?

What comes to mind when you think about God’s love for you?

WHAT IS A SACRAMENT?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines the sacraments as “efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us” (CCC 1131). This means that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the sacraments actually give us the grace that they represent. The sacraments are visible, tangible signs that make present to us the invisible, supernatural actions of Christ. God desires that we intimately know his love and the presence and power of his grace, so these sacramental signs allow us to experience in a real and human way God’s gift of divine love and grace. Grace is a totally free and unmerited gift from God that gives us a participation in his own divine life. The graces imparted by the Church through the sacraments are called sacramental graces. The effects of these graces are both personal and ecclesial: communion with God and with the Church (see CCC 1129; 1134). They bear fruit in daily life through fidelity to the demands of Christian life and active participation in the Church’s mission. The Catechism also tells us that it is actually Jesus who is at work in the sacraments. Although we see and hear the priest speaking the words and performing the actions, it is really Jesus who is working through the sacraments to offer us the grace he won for us through his sacrifice on the Cross (see CCC 1084–85).

HOW DO I KNOW THE SACRAMENTS WORK?

The Church teaches that the sacraments act *ex opere operato*, which literally means “by the very fact of the action’s being performed” (see CCC 1127–28). The power of the sacraments comes from Christ—not from our holiness or the holiness of the one presiding over it. We can be disposed to be more or less receptive to the fruits of each sacrament, but each of the sacraments effectively communicates its proper grace. Just as the visible signs of the sacraments are humble, everyday things—water, oil, bread, wine—the effects of the sacraments are often hidden and imperceptible. Even with great faith and an open heart, we may not always feel fed when we receive the Eucharist, but the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, and if we are properly disposed to receive this sacrament with reverence, it will nourish us, whether we feel like it does or not.

When he revealed his name to Moses at the burning bush, he revealed not only his power but also his presence.

How can this presence of Christ in the Eucharist be a source of strength and consolation as you journey through your life?

In what ways can you grow in appreciating and embracing Christ’s presence in the Eucharist?

Please see below status of the Ph. II Capital Campaign as of 6/30/18. We have made some very good progress in our debt reduction on this project thanks to all of the Sacred Heart Parishioners who have been so generous in their contributions toward this effort. In summary, we retired an additional **\$14,937** in loan principal since our last report on 3/31/2018. Our balance on the long-term loan as of 6/30/18 is **\$87,813**. Again, thank you to all who have contributed to this Ph. II Debt Reduction campaign. Your efforts are greatly appreciated. For those who are still contributing towards their pledge amounts, please continue to do so. We will also continue to accept any additional contributions toward our overall campaign goal.

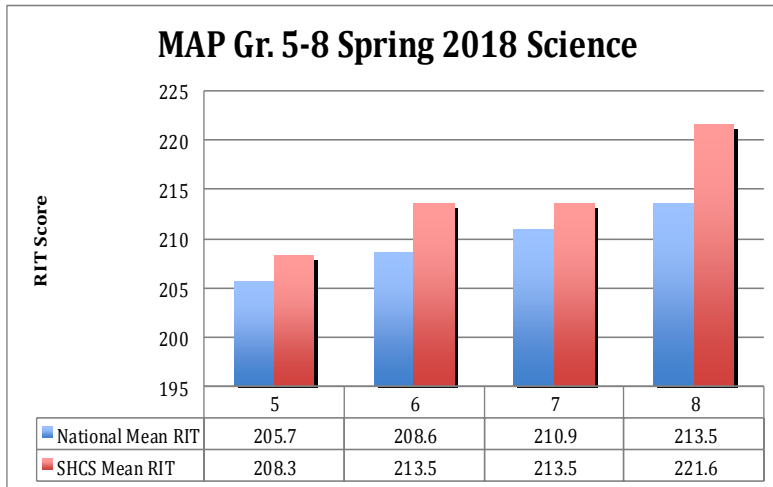

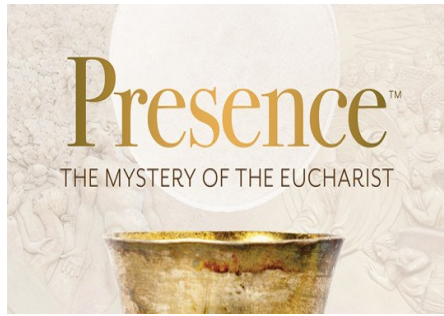

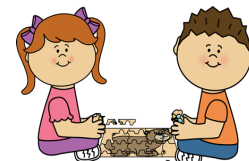

GOSPEL MEDITATION

August 5, 2018 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In an on-demand society, it's not always easy to imagine life with less. The crowds of Jesus' day depended on the weather and successful growing seasons for their livelihood. For many of Jesus' listeners, even "food that perishes" would have been a welcome relief. Jesus acknowledges this but tries to draw them deeper. "You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." For people who have just witnessed a miracle, the response is strangely marked by ingratitude. "What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert." Jesus fed them for one day, but Moses interceded with God for 40 years of bread. "Jesus," they seem to say, "can't you just give us more?"

How often do we behave similarly in the spiritual life? "If I only I had more patience, then I could be kind to her." "I could be welcoming if I was more outgoing, but that's just not me." "I know I'd be a better parent if I just had more time." Like the crowds, we want Jesus to give us more. We always don't want him to completely shift our paradigm. Perhaps it's not "more patience" we need, but a deeper sense of our own imperfections for a greater sense of empathy. Maybe God is inviting you not to entertain an entire group, but to seek out the quiet person on the fringe. And time may limit you from family engagement, but could God be asking you to reorder your priorities entirely?

After all, it wasn't more loaves that the people needed. Jesus is "the bread of life," who sustains our most essential needs. This week, are you looking for more or are you looking for God Himself?
