

Keeping the Faith in Challenging Times

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith." Hebrews 12:1-

These words, inspired by the Holy Spirit and found in the Letter to the Hebrews, offer us sound advice in how to keep the faith in challenging times. When it comes to living out the Catholic faith in 2018 we face many head winds. Perhaps the greatest head wind today is the sexual abuse crisis. In the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis we know all too well this challenge. With the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report that was released on August 14, news of the failures of clergy and religious in that state and the manner that bishops dealt with these failures, serve to reopen the wounds of the failures here. The ones who feel the wounds most acutely are victims of sexual abuse.

Because of these things the burden Catholics feel when it comes to practicing the faith are real. Many have left the practice of the faith because of these things. So how do we keep the faith in light of these challenges? How do we help others to keep the faith? We keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith. From the very beginning of his ministry Jesus prepared his disciples for challenges. In his parables about the Kingdom of God here on earth he spoke about the wheat and weeds growing up together in His Kingdom until the end of the age. Jesus called a group of men that are known to us as "the twelve apostles." All of them had many gifts and talents. Yet, all of them also had weaknesses to varying degrees. The story of St. Peter who denied even knowing Jesus on the eve of Good Friday, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him for thirty pieces of silver serve to remind us of these weaknesses. In order to keep the faith in challenging times we must keep our eyes fixed on Jesus.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

September 2, 2018 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Judgment tends to have a bad reputation. We often associate it with condemnation, and in the Gospels, we associate it with the Pharisees. Today's Gospel features the Pharisees doing exactly what we expect. "They observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands." The Jewish people had strict purification laws that applied to all areas of life. The Pharisees attempt to accuse Jesus of not following the ancestral traditions. Jesus doesn't take offense at their judgments per se. He instead points out the hypocrisy of their words. "You hypocrites? this people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."

From there, Jesus turns his attention to the concerns of the heart. "The things that come from within are what defile." He lists off a number of sins, including some the Pharisees were likely struggling with, including evil thoughts, envy, and arrogance. When we examine the list, perhaps we're reminded of our own trips to the confessional! As we strive to follow Jesus and live with integrity, we must be aware of our hearts. We must judge our own actions. Are they leading us closer to God or away from Him? Are we growing in love of our neighbor, or are we becoming more closed in on ourselves?

As we move into this week, consider the state of our own heart. Perhaps you are overly scrupulous in less important areas. Perhaps there are large areas of overlooked sin that you've excused for too long. Whatever it is, the judgment of God need not cripple us. He offers us a share in His mercy as soon as we turn to Him. This week, allow your heart to be transformed!




