Celebrating Peace: The 100th Anniversary of Armistice Day

On November 11th, 1918 at 11:00am, an "Armistice," coming from the Latin word "armistitium" literally meaning the "standing still of fighting weapons, or arms" came into effect thus ending the Great War, what we know better as World War I. After four years of fighting 8,528,831 military personnel were killed in action, 21,189,154 million were wounded, while 7,750,919 were either prisoners of war or missing in action. As the Encyclopedia Britannica notes the civilian population fared no better, "It has been estimated that the number of civilian deaths attributable to the war was higher than the military casualties, or around 13,000,000. These civilian deaths were largely caused by starvation, exposure, disease, military encounters, and massacres." U.S. soldiers and navy personnel killed in action was 116,516. U.S. wounded was 204,002 while an additional 4,500 U.S. troops were either prisoners of war or missing in action. Up to this point in history no war had caused so much loss of life. One of the primary reasons for this was the use of 19th century military tactics with 20th century weapons of war. Those new weapons included the use of machine guns, field artillery, chemical warfare, the use of gas masks, flamethrowers, tank battles, aerial warfare, an aircraft carrier, even wireless communication. These new weapons of war outclassed traditional cavalry and infantry troops who were decimated by these new weapons of war. After the initial advances of what became known as the Central Powers of Prussia and Austria-Hungary to the western front in much of France and the eastern front on the border of Romania, Austria-Hungary, and western Russia both sides dug in and trench warfare ensued leading to years of stalemate. In the meantime, on the seas, in Africa, the Middle East, India, Japan, eastern Russia, and China. The United States did not enter the war until the spring of 1917 after the breakdown of diplomatic relations between Germany and the United States as well as the sinking of U.S. merchant vessels by German U-boats. The U.S. entry into the war enabled the Allies of France, Great Britain, Russia, Italy to break stalemate leading to an end of the war. By the end of the war, four large dynastic monarchies many of whom were related to varying degrees and their associated empires ceased to be. The Austro-Hungarian empire was dismembered, the German Confederation and Kingdom known as Prussia with Kaiser Wilhelm also ended. The Bolshevik Revolution in Russia swamped the Romanov dynasty and brought atheistic communism into the world. In addition, the Ottoman Empire ceased to be remaking the middle eastern map. At wars end many new national boundaries were drawn and the seeds of future conflict were sown.

The 100th Anniversary of Armistice day should remind everyone of the horrors of war. What many thought would end quickly in 1914 radically changed the world. The British World order regnant since the 17th century was in it's final days, while a new world order was in the process of being made. An even greater war, with even more destruction and loss of life completed the remaking of the world order that began with World War I. Given the horror of these conflicts celebrating the end of fighting and the resumption of peace is fitting. Let us pray that the current world order begun at the conclusion of the second World War changes organically, and not through the horror of war.

I hope you find a way to acknowledge this important anniversary. With a concert scheduled Sunday afternoon at 4:00 PM here at Sacred Heart with the Robbinsdale City Band in "A salute to Veteran's" and our upcoming program on Wednesday Nov. 14th at 9:15am in our gymnasium let us observe this important 100th anniversary of Armistice Day.

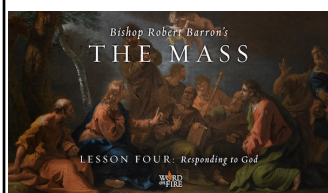

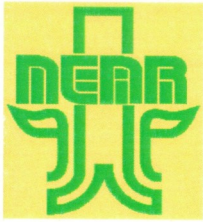
