From the Heart

The Beginning and the End
 Written on Monday, November 19th, 2018

The book of Revelation is filled with images and metaphors. The symbolic language requires added study both of the 1st Century Christian churches and early Christian writings, and also the apocalyptic literature of the Jewish people found in the Old Testament. As we celebrate the Divine Kingship of Christ this Sunday, we are given powerful metaphors in the scriptures read at Mass in the following statement.

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, " says the Lord God, "the one who is and who was and who is to come, the almighty."

Alpha "A" and Omega "Ω" are the names given to the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. In using them in the Book of Revelation sometimes they are translated as "I am the Beginning and the End." We have a saying in America, "Everything you need from A to Z." While the American saying refers to commerce or knowledge, the saying found in the Book of Revelation is so much more. To say "I am the Alpha and the Omega" is to say that God is everything, that there is nothing without God. The created order, all that we see and don't see, it's very existence is contingent, or dependent upon on God who not only created it, thus making a beginning, but it is the same God who sustains it, because God is "Being" itself. It can be a difficult concept to grasp. Just as a pre-born child is dependent upon his or her mother for life and sustaining life, so too is everything dependent upon God for it's existence. Unlike a child in the womb who will eventually be born, and once raised be independent, we never will be independent from our Maker who sustains us and creation itself.

For some this can be disconcerting. A desire to be independent, self-capable, untethered is implanted in the American psyche, and the idea of the rugged individual is one that continues. The popularity of the libertarian ethic stems from this. Hearing the saying "I am the Alpha and the Omega" is meant to free us from, however, from the false idea that we can ever be independent from God. Dependence on God, however, is not some facile slavery to a higher power, precisely because in his goodness God made us in His image and likeness. He gave us the gift of reason and freedom. He made us for love, to love, and to be loved. He even gives us His Son who joins our humanity and shows us what it means to truly love and make life to be a gift given away.

Yes, Lord, you are the Alpha and the Omega, you are all. In truth we acknowledge your sovereignty and give you thanks for making us in your image and likeness, for equipping us with reason and intelligence, and making us free, in order that we may love as you love. It may seem like a contradiction to be dependent and yet free, but that is what we are thanks to your love. Help each of us to live our lives as gift wherever we have been planted, including here at Sacred Heart.


