Advent: A Time to Reflect on Salvation History

Advent is a time to reflect on Salvation History. Over the course advent a brief reflection on events and figures of salvation history leading to Jesus will be offered here. If you have children, or grandchildren consider putting together an Advent Tree using these symbols for ornaments.



December 2 – Creation: No reflection on salvation history can begin without recognizing our origin from God. God made us in his own image, declaring us “very good.” We know our calling is to dwell in his love, and yet we so often stray from him. Even then his love is unbounded, that he would send his only Son to bring us back to him. It is only then we can truly be “very good.”



December 3 — Adam and Eve: Sin became part of the human condition through our first parents. Eating the apple was part disobedience and part wanting to be equal to God. While God made us to be like him, our incorporation into the divine life happens on his terms, not ours. Humanity’s sinfulness results from skewed perspectives of creation, an inability to submit to the will of the One who made all things and to respect our proper role in the relationship we have with him. The result is God’s plan of redemption, whereby he sends us his Son to show us the true way to be human.



December 4 — Noah: The story of Noah and his ark illustrates the corruptive and insidious nature of sin. Even the most personal of sins affect others, in ways we will often never recognize in this life. While God’s action in this story offers an opportunity for a “new creation” through his covenant with Noah, we can rightfully understand this as foreshadowing the new life to be found in Christ, which requires us to leave sin behind and follow Christ’s way.



December 5 — Abraham: All mankind has been created for a relationship with God. When God established his covenant with Abraham, he entered into a relationship with a people that will be particularly his own. This solidifies the relationship God has intended for his people from the beginning. Abraham’s story reiterates that we must reject anything that keeps us from faithfulness to God.



December 6 — Isaac: Those who worship the true God learn through Abraham’s ordeal that sacrifice is essential. When God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac — the one through whom all of the promises God made would come true — he was willing to give God everything. This foreshadowed the offering of God’s Son in the new and everlasting covenant.



December 7 — Jacob: Jacob who was renamed Israel by God, since Jacob contended with God in a wrestling match with an Angel is a complex figure. He became the inheritor of God’s covenant with Abraham despite having lied to achieve the birthright that made it possible. He stole his brother Esau’s birthright. Nonetheless, God remained faithful in the context of Jacob’s situation. God’s love is indestructible. His twelve sons are the Patriarchs that make up the twelve tribes of Israel.



December 8 — Tamar: Tamar’s story represents how God’s gifts can be misused, illustrating how God’s love and generosity can even be exploited. Tamar was maligned after her first two husbands died, and she deceived their father, Judah, to secure a position of esteem in the line of Abraham. And she did, giving birth to twins and becoming one of only five women named in the genealogy of Jesus according to Matthew’s Gospel.

Other Notes: Jesus says: “Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find.” His admonition and our commitment to the mission and ministries of the Church of the Sacred Heart is why we are engaged in an annual increased offertory program. I want to publicly express my thanks to Dan Fisher for offering his witness about the importance of the mission and ministries of the Church of the Sacred Heart. Hearing your story along with your wife Amy and your four boys, Peter, Leo, Timothy, and Linus last Sunday, November 25th and this Saturday, December 1st is a blessing for our entire parish community. Thank you for embracing the mission of Sacred Heart and letting others in our parish know how your family is being **Formed in His Heart, Serving with His Heart, and Giving from His Heart**. Your response to this program will provide us the necessary information to sustain and plan for the future of our ministries here at Sacred Heart.

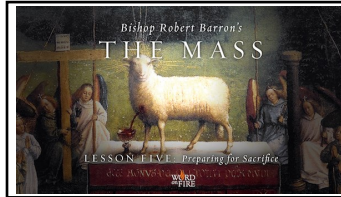
