WELCOME TO THE 2018-19 MUSIC AND FINE ARTS SERIES AT THE CHURCH OF THE SACRED HEART

We have many great events planned this year centering around the 30th anniversary of our wonderful pipe organ. The great Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart once wrote "in my eyes and ears... the Pipe Organ is the king of instruments." The Pipe Organ is one of the most complex of all mechanical instruments ever developed. Composed of a wind raising device, a windchest also known as the soundboard with its' pipes, and the keyboard and valves, which, when engaged, or "played", admits wind to the pipes and the Pipe Organ is capable of making an orchestra of music. It is the King of Instruments because it can produce sounds approximating almost all the major instruments in their various classes, whether wood-winds or reeds, brass or horns, or the multiplicity of stringed instruments, the Pipe Organ is its own orchestra. In her document on the Liturgy, The Second Vatican Council noted: "In the Latin Church the pipe organ is to be held in high esteem, for it is the traditional musical instrument which adds a wonderful splendor to the Church's ceremonies and powerfully lifts up man's mind to God and to higher things." We are blessed here at The Church of the Sacred Heart in Robbinsdale to have our own Pipe Organ, installed in 1989, after much fundraising, it has accompanied divine worship for thirty years. Join us at Sunday Mass, and at the musical concerts listed here, to celebrate music and thirty years of our glorious pipes!






FRIDAY, JANUARY 25, 2019 - 7:00 PM MADE IN MINNESOTA AND PENNSYLVANIA
