

**Announcing the "Keep It or Cut It Challenge"**

As you all know for several years now I have kept my hair in a longer more "apostolic" fashion. Back in September 2017 during the Annual Meeting of the Northern Lieutenancy of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem – yes, it is a mouthful – one of the Bishops present who was also being inducted into the order asked me during lunch why I kept my hair long. We did not have much time before we needed to get on a bus for the Cathedral of St. Louis so without elaboration I told him, "so I could look more like Jesus." With long hair and a full beard some have thought perhaps I was a Russian or

Greek Orthodox priest, since many of them also wear their hair and beard long in the more "apostolic" fashion. Well the time may be coming for a change, and by that, I mean a real hair cut and not just a trim.

In order to make this possible change fun, exciting, and fruitful for Sacred Heart Catholic School to bolster tuition aid scholarships I am introducing the **"Keep It or Cut It Challenge."** Parishioners and really anyone who would like to have a say in what happens to my hair will have an opportunity to do so by donating to Sacred Heart Catholic School. This contest has two sides. The **"Keep It - Team St. John Vianney"** side, since St. John Vianney had long hair, and the **"Cut It – Team St. Paul"** side, since St. Paul is usually depicted with short hair or even a bald head.

Here is how it will work.  
 If you want me to keep my hair long, then you donate money as many times as you want to the "Keep It – Team St. John Vianney" side.

If you want me to cut my hair short, then you donate money as many times as you want to the "Cut It – Team St. Paul" side.

The challenge will end on Feb. 8<sup>th</sup>, the date of the Sacred Heart Catholic School Gala, with the winning side announced at the end of the Gala.

You can bring your donation either to the parish or school office, or donate online through the parish or school website. A promo video will appear on both sites. If you bring in your donation to the office indicate which Team you are on in memo of your check by writing "Keep It – Team St. John Vianney" or "Cut It – Team St. Paul." What I end up doing is completely up to you for the benefit of students attending Sacred Heart Catholic School. If Team St. John Vianney wins I will keep it long at least until Fun Fest 2019. If Team St. Paul wins I will get it cut this winter very soon after the Gala. We will keep you apprised of which side is winning in the weeks ahead.


