Nick has been an altar server at Sacred Heart since 5th grade.

Scouting is a journey to be experienced. Nick has had many scouting experiences, including camping trips, learning life skills, teamwork, leadership and making new friends. Nick began his scouting journey in the first grade with Cub Scouts and continued through elementary and high school until he reached Eagle Scout. Nick has many memories to share.

Nick and his dad, Jason, went on multiple camping trips, including Zero Hero where they camped outside in the winter in a parachute and hiked 82 miles at Philmont in New Mexico. 


