Holy Week: The Greatest Week of the Liturgical Year

The culmination of the Lenten Season begins with the celebration of Palm Sunday which commences Holy Week. The ceremonies of Holy Week offer some ancient customs which unite us across the centuries with fellow Christians. We should take heart in the realization that saints like St. Benedict, St. Gregory the Great, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Dominic, St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Catherine of Siena, St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Charles Borromeo, St. Theresa of Calcutta, St. John Paul II and a whole host of others have engaged in exactly the same prayers, rituals, and actions. This reminds us that the life of the Church is something truly great that endures even as other things pass away. They have held the palms singing "Hosanna to the Son of David", so will we. They have stood to hear the Passion according to St. Matthew, so will we. They have heard bells sound out in joy as the Gloria makes a brief return on Holy Thursday only to be replaced by the stark sound of the clappers, and so will we. They have heard and sung the mysterious and solemn Pange Lingua Gloriosi sung as the Blessed Sacrament is brought to the Altar of Repose, we will hear the same. They have witnessed the Sacred Ministers of the Liturgy prostrate themselves in silence before the stripped altar on Good Friday, so will we. They have heard the Passion according to St. John chanted in ancient tones or read for the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday, so will we. They have assented in their hearts to the solemn prayers for the Church and the World on Good Friday, so will we. They have witnessed the veiled cross processed into the Church by the Deacon bearing the Savior of the World, they have seen it unveiled as ancient words proclaiming the savior of the world are sung, they have worshipped and venerated the cross that represents our salvation, they have even crept forward to adore and kiss the wood of the cross, or the feet of the savior represented on the cross, so will we. They have received the lighted hand candles which represents the Risen Christ, so will we. They have heard the great song of Exultation sung by the Deacon or Priest, so will we, they have kept vigil during the night hearing the great stories of God's saving covenant which finds its fulfillment in Christ, so will we. They have witnessed the elect catechumens receive the Sacraments of eternal life, so will we. They have received the Blessed Sacrament fulfilling their Easter Duty to receive the Lord in Holy Communion at least once per year, so will we. They have heard the final words "Ite, Missa est, alleluia, alleluia!" so will we. We should not take for granted these solemn ceremonies. While the Sacred Triduum may not be required liturgical celebrations for all the faithful to attend like Christmas, Easter and the other Sundays throughout the year but for those who do, their faith is strengthened. These rites build faith, bring life, and bring peace. I pray that you will join us for the liturgies of Holy Week.

Good Friday begins a nine day period of prayer where we are encouraged to reflect on the power of the cross in the Divine Mercy of the Jesus. Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy over the nine days leading to the second Sunday of Easter, which is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, is a simple way to personally commemorate the Mercy of God. To pray the chaplet simply take out your Rosary and begin by saying the following prayers: First say an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Apostles' Creed.

Then say on the first large bead the following: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, or your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins, and those of the whole world.

Then going to the first small bead say: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the world.

Repeat this short prayer on all ten small beads, and then repeat the "**Eternal Father**" prayer as above when you reach the next large bead, then on the ten small beads repeat the prayer for each bead "**For the sake of His sorrowful passion, etc.** As you conclude praying through the beads on your Rosary in the manner described above the chaplet is concluded with the following prayer recited three times:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us, and on the whole world.

Say the chaplet for nine days, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father at least one time, receive Holy Communion of the 2nd Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, and go to confession during the week prior to Divine Mercy Sunday or the week following Easter Sunday and you will received a plenary indulgence which is the remission of any temporal punishment due to sin. The simplest way to understand what temporal punishment due to sin is to recall a child who has done something wrong, they ask for forgiveness and receive it, but a punishment is still given to teach them to no longer do the wrong thing. When it comes to an indulgence it is like the parent remitting the punishment intended. Forgiveness restores us to God's grace, but the absolution of the confessional does not take away the penance or punishment that wrongful actions, even forgives still bring about, but a plenary or partial indulgence does just that because of the infinite merits of Christ and the good works of members of the body of Christ, both past and present whose good deeds Christ makes meritorious.

Hosanna to the Messiah!

While Jesus would not be crowned an earthly king, Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem has many parallels to the Messianic expectations of the Hebrew people. Before entering, Jesus requisitions a donkey from its owner. In the ancient world, kings had this right. Yet the animal that Jesus requests is rare - a colt upon which no one else has sat yet. Yet, it's a donkey. This is no great war-charger, no magnificent animal. Jesus acts with all the authority of an earthly king, yet his kingdom is one of simplicity and peace. As the disciples throw cloaks over the donkey, the crowd spreads theirs on the road. This ancient gesture dates back to the line of kings descended from David. Not only are these physical kingly gestures, but the crowd of followers cries out in jubilation and praise. The Messiah has come to Jerusalem!
