

Capital Expense Fund Project Update

Once again, thank you to all who have helped make these projects come to fruition. Your generosity is greatly appreciated! If there are any questions regarding any of these projects, please contact Mary Daugherty in the Parish Office.

- AED's All new AED Devices are installed with visible location signs. Sacred Heart is working with Paul Mendoza of Advanced First Aid, Inc. to be certified as a Heart Safe Campus. We recently completed a First Aid/CPR Training course for all Parish Staff and other Parish Committee Members and Ushers/Greeters. We will be coordinating another training session. More information to follow.
- 2. Church Sound System This project is complete. We have received many compliments that the sound clarity is much improved.
- M-Rooms Upgrade The new carpet, paint, blinds and wall/corner protectors are installed. We are working on finalizing artwork for the walls depicting the life of Mary.
- 4. Convent Foundation/School & Church Door Stonework Our masonry contractor is tentatively scheduled to start work on this project May 20, 2019.
- 5. Elevator Security We have a project plan in place to install a reception/security desk at the West Broadway Door Entrance (Door 8) with a target completion date of August 26, 2019.
- 6. Hubbard Vestibule Roof Replacement We are currently seeking bids for the replacement of the Hubbard Vestibule flat roof where we have had significant leaking over the past few years. We have met with (2) roofing vendors to date, with (2) more planned. Once we receive all bids, we will review and move forward with this roof replacement.
- 7. New Kids Club Entrance Door This project is complete with a new door in place that is more secure.

The purpose of the Lay Advisory Board is to promote healing in the Archdiocese of St. Paul & Minneapolis in the wake of the clergy sex abuse scandal and following the conclusion of the Archdiocesan Bankruptcy. Each parish has selected a member of their Parish Pastoral Council to represent their parish at the deanery level. Sacred Heart is located in Deanery 9. At the deanery level one representative is selected to serve on Archbishop Hebda's Lay Advisory Board in Saint Paul.

My role as the parish representative to Deanery 9 is to bring forward any ideas or concerns from parishioners at Sacred Heart to the deanery level for consideration for bringing forward to the archdiocesan level. The purpose of the board is to lay the groundwork for a future synod which will determine how the archdiocese moves forward in the years ahead and promotes healing and reconciliation in the wake of recent events.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

"I give you a new commandment: love one another." With these words, Jesus sums up the law and the prophets in one concise phrase. Love one another. After 2,000 years, you'd think we'd have it figured out by now! But all too often we fail in this commandment. Perhaps we mistake "love" for mere "common decency." Perhaps we've been betrayed, or our own visions of love have been tarnished or misrepresented in our lives. Blessedly, Jesus doesn't leave us without a guide.

"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Jesus himself modeled what this love should look like. So what are some of the characteristics of the love of Christ? Humility, for one. St. Paul writes that Jesus "emptied Himself." In becoming man, Jesus puts aside the full splendor of the Godhead. Not only does he become human, but he takes on many of the mundane privations of human life. He spent most of his life in relative poverty - especially by our standards - as a common laborer. When he began gaining popularity as a preacher, he still traveled on foot and spent nights in other people's homes or outdoors. Jesus' love is generous. He was always available to the crowds and to being interrupted by people in need. He invested time in his disciples and patiently taught them about the kingdom of God. The love of Jesus is also courageous. He encountered many people deemed less worthy of human respect, due to being public sinners or having a physical or mental disability. Jesus was brave in breaking these social boundaries to show care and concern to the outcast. These traits are possible for us to imitate! Indeed, we are hardly identifiable as Christians without them. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

How do people know that you are a disciple of Jesus Christ? Some folks prefer to keep their faith a secret and rarely mention their belief in Jesus. Others are more vocal and readily tell people that they are Christian. For Jesus, there is another way to recognize whether one is a disciple. He tells his friends that all will know they are disciples if they have love for one another. The love to which Jesus calls us to is not just an earthly love. It's not just about doing nice things for people or even keeping positive thoughts about others. Jesus' love is divine love. Put simply, Jesus became human so that we can become divine. We are called to look at the world, people, and ourselves as God does. This requires unconditional compassion and a whole lot of mercy and forgiveness. We cannot do this alone. That is why the risen Christ remains with us, especially through the Eucharist, to help us become who he is. If done correctly, there will be no question about who has our allegiance.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Question:

I've heard of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. What are they, and what's the difference? Answer:

As God has shown us mercy, so too are we called to show mercy to those we encounter. We see mercy throughout the Gospels, but the parable in Matthew 25 forms the foundation for the first set of Works of Mercy. This parable of the last judgment shows each person being asked how well they cared for those around them, and being reminded that this care for those in need is care for God Himself. Each person is asked if they have fed the hungry, given drink to the thirsty, clothed the naked, sheltered the stranger, cared for the sick, and visited the imprisoned. These along with burying the dead - are the Corporal Works of Mercy, as they primarily concern the physical life of a person.

The list of the Spiritual Works of Mercy developed later. These actions of love primarily concern the inner life of a person. They are instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, admonishing sinners, bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving offenses, comforting the afflicted, and praying for both the living and the dead. All of these actions are concrete ways of bringing the love of God into the world.
