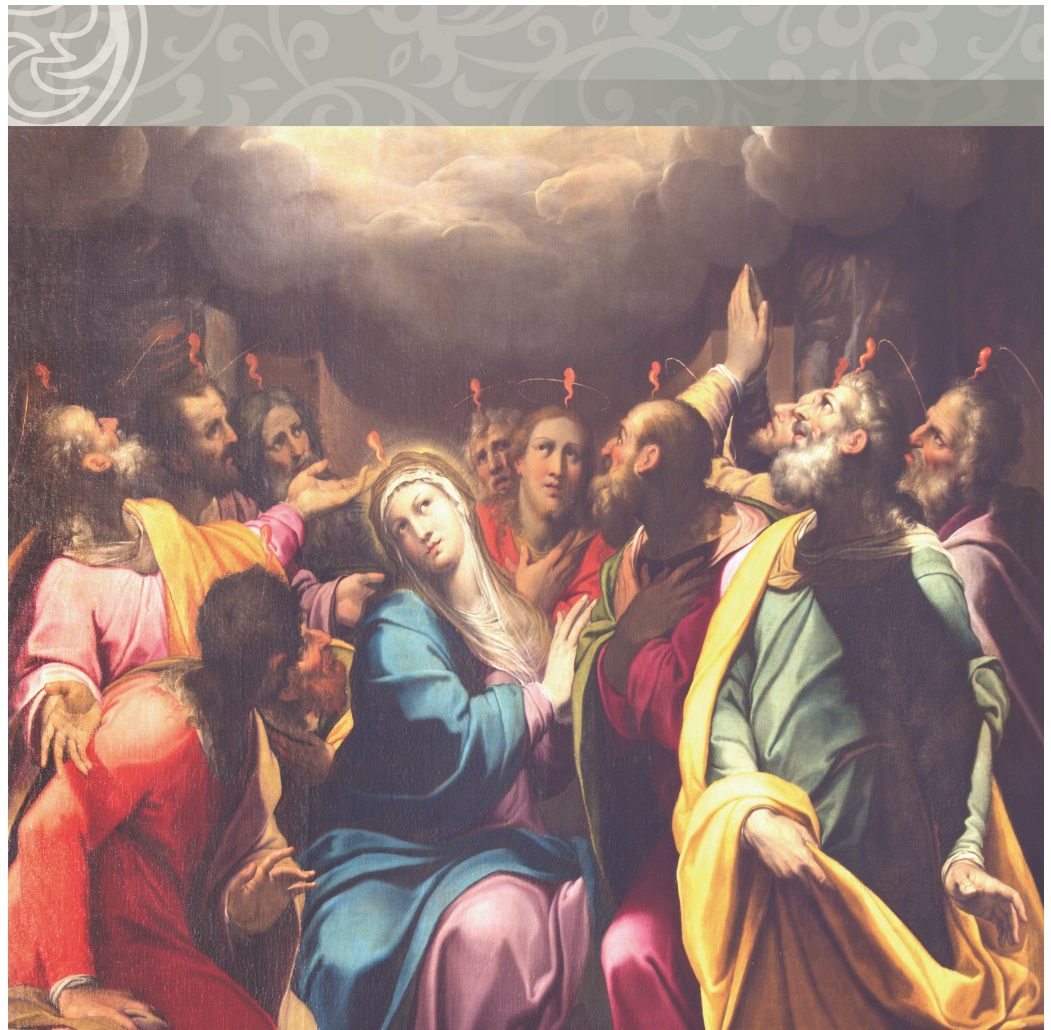

Holy Land Pilgrimage

I am very excited about our Parish Holy Land Pilgrimage next spring from April 28, 2020 – May 8, 2020. I have never been to the Holy Land. To walk where Jesus walked, to visit the places where he preached, cast out demons, healed the sick, performed his miracles, manifested his divinity, suffered and died for us, and rose from the dead is truly remarkable and breathtaking to consider. To go there with fellow parishioners of Sacred Heart Catholic Church makes this trip even more exciting for me.

This past week our Tour Director, John Sonnen, hosted a Q & A session for those interested in this pilgrimage. **Our director told me at the recent Q & A to share with all of you that for those who register for the tour prior to August 31st, 2019 there will be a \$200 discount on the advertised cost of the pilgrimage. Enclosed in the bulletin this week is the registration form and day to day details of the pilgrimage.**

I've known John Sonnen, from Orbis Catholic Travels, since grade school where I first got to know him through altar serving. John was in my younger brother Karl's graduating class from Saint Agnes High School. When I was a junior at the University of St. Thomas and a student at St. John Vianney Seminary John Sonnen entered the college seminary where I got to know him even more. John has been leading tours since 2004. Over the course of the next year he will lead five distinct tours to the Holy Land. The website for Orbis Catholic Travel is <https://oc-travel.com>.

When he asked me if I would serve as a chaplain for a pilgrimage to the Holy Land for Sacred Heart Parishioners it was his connections to world class local guides in the Holy Land that convinced me to say yes. In fact, when he told me that the local guide he works with, Amer, a Catholic resident of the Holy Land, and member of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher was the guide used by Fr. Patrick Lannon, it didn't take long for me to say yes. Fr. Patrick Lannon is one of the legendary priests of the Archdiocese, who had been pastor of Nativity Parish in St. Paul in the 1980s and 1990s. He served as chaplain for many pilgrimages to the Holy Land. Fr. Lannon expected the best.

One of the differences with John Sonnen of **Orbis Catholic Travels** is the small group size. Our group will be no more than 40 persons which makes movement to the various pilgrimage sites much quicker than larger groups of multiple busses. I hope you will consider joining.

AIM Higher Scholarship opens up a new summer application period beginning May 31

AIM Higher has additional scholarship money to award students that want to attend a Catholic school. The process opens May 31st. With this additional round of funding, they aim to make it another record-setting year, once again surpassing their goal to increase the number of scholarships they award by 10%.

Here are three things to know:

1. The TADS application will open on May 31 and close on August 4.
2. Scholarships will be awarded on a rolling basis to help new families make a quick decision about where to send their children.
3. For any family who applied after the first deadline (February 17) to be considered, they will need to go back into TADS and update their application.

Parents and guardians can add the Aim Higher Foundation to an existing TADS application from their TADS accounts.

Here's how:

- On their home screen, under the "Most Recent Financial Aid Application" section, click the green Add School button.
- Click the green Add School or Scholarship button (yes, again).
- In the School Search field, type Aim Higher (or even Aim will work).
- A dropdown menu will appear; click to select Aim Higher.
- Select which student or students you would like to apply for Aim Higher, then click the green Submit button.

Follow the step-by-step instructions to complete adding the scholarship.

Each parish has selected a member of their Parish Pastoral Council to represent their parish at the deanery level. Sacred Heart is located in Deanery 9. At the deanery level one representative is selected to serve on Archbishop Hebda's Lay Advisory Board in Saint Paul.

My role as the parish representative to Deanery 9 is to bring forward any ideas or concerns from parishioners at Sacred Heart to the deanery level for consideration for bringing forward to the archdiocesan level. The purpose of the board is to lay the groundwork for a future synod which will determine how the archdiocese moves forward in the years ahead and promotes healing and reconciliation in the wake of recent events.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Question:

Why do we celebrate Pentecost when we do?

Answer:

The book of Acts unpacks the events immediately following Jesus' ascension into heaven. The Apostles and other disciples were told to pray in Jerusalem and await another outpouring of the Holy Spirit. As the weeks ticked on, the Jewish Festival of Weeks approached. This festival took place 50 days after Passover and celebrated the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The Festival of Weeks (or "Pentecost" in Greek) was a great pilgrimage feast, with Jews from all over the ancient world convening on Jerusalem for the celebration.

It was on Pentecost that God chose to send the Holy Spirit. Here, the new law of love was etched into the hearts of the disciples. As he burst out onto the balcony above the multinational crowd, Peter proclaimed the message of the resurrection, and the Holy Spirit enabled every listener to hear in their native language. 3,000 people were baptized that day! The disciples - and every baptized person - receives the gifts and zeal necessary to bring a new message of salvation to the people of God.

Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church

Welcome to one of the newest feasts in the Catholic Church! The feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, was established by Pope Francis in spring 2018. While the formal celebration is new, the honor is as old as the Gospels. Jesus spoke few words on the Cross, but several of them were addressed to his mother and the apostle John. "Woman, behold your son." "Son, behold your mother." This means far more than simply someone to care for Mary as she got on in years and someone for John to celebrate Jewish festivals with. John represents all of us, the Church. Jesus entrusted Mary to us as our mother. At the end of the historic Second Vatican Council in the midst of tumultuous times, Bl. Pope Paul VI formally declared Mary as Mother of the Church and invited us to pray to her under that title.
