


Epidemic of Gun Violence

Late last Sunday there were two mass shootings in our nation following in quick succession. The first began in El Paso and the shooter targeted Hispanics. He even posted a manifesto. Twenty-Two are confirmed dead as of this writing. He had been reported to be a white supremacist. Later that evening in Dayton, Ohio another young man, who has been reported to be ardent supporter of Antifa, a leftist group, responsible for the recent beating of reporter, Andy Ngo, killed nine. Missed in the headlines was one of the worst weekends of gun violence so far in 2019 in Chicago. As the New York Times reported recently "the police said seven people were killed and 52 wounded by gunfire throughout Chicago from Friday evening to Sunday, including a 5-year-old boy who was shot in the leg while sitting in a car. Early Sunday, 17 people were shot in a period of two hours in a small pocket on the city's West Side, turning residential blocks into chaotic scenes of ambulances, grieving family members and cars pockmarked with bullets. There were 32 separate shooting incidents throughout the weekend, the police said."

There is not enough space in this brief article, nor time, to delve into all the causes of these things, but the propaganda and ideology that turns young Muslim men into Jihadists, can also turn others into killers, whether it is the ideology of white supremacists, or antifa. The violence in urban areas like Chicago because of gang warfare reveal the fundamental conviction of our Catholic Faith that the human person is fallen, and in need of redemption. The world needs the teachings of Jesus and his redemptive work - Love for God, and love for neighbor, and sacrificial love characterize our Savior. There is much evil in this world, a concrete response we can make is to rededicate ourselves to Christian teachings and commend ourselves to the Savior we all need.

The Assumption: A Sign of Hope

Is the resurrection a concept or reality? For many of us, the resurrection of the dead may be a stray idea recite in the Nicene Creed. Heaven we discuss. But resurrection? The feast of the Assumption is a reminder to us that heaven gets even better! We pray that the souls of the faithful departed would soon be united to God in heaven. The truth is, the separation between our souls and our bodies was not God's original plan for things. It's one of the results of the Fall, of original sin. At the end of time and Jesus' second coming, our bodies and souls will be reunited. Lest we forget, Mary's Assumption is the reminder. Today, we celebrate that Mary is enjoying what we, too, hope to participate in - complete joy in heaven with our God, experienced body and soul. Today and every day, let's pray for those who have died and that we may meet them again in the heavenly kingdom.




