

Nick Stark:Seminarian for the Diocese of Des Moines, studying in St. Paul, and assigned to Sacred Heart as his teaching parish.

Greetings and peace to all. I have met a lot of the good people here at Sacred Heart parish, but there are some that I haven't met yet. So, I thought it would be a great opportunity to use my first bulletin article of the year to explain who I am, what I am doing to prepare for the priesthood, and more importantly what I'm doing this year in your parish. I come from Urbandale, IA which is a suburb of Des Moines and my home parish is Saint Pius X in Urbandale. I went to the Catholic grade school there and afterwards attended Dowling Catholic High School in West Des Moines. I have a story about how I ended up in seminary, but perhaps I can tell that another time. I entered seminary in 2013 and attended Loras College in Dubuque, IA for my years in minor seminary. I graduated in 2017 and now attend The Saint Paul Seminary where I am in my third year of theological studies.

A large part of our formation as priests comes from the experiences we get from our teaching parish. I was assigned to Sacred Heart in the fall of 2017 and started a teaching parish committee with some of the wonderful people here in the parish. My committee is a group of seven members and myself, in which I present a topic and we discuss that topic in the context of the parish, the local church, and the universal church as a whole. The teaching parish committee meetings help me to become more aware of things going on in the parish and in those families who make up the parish. The sharing of ideas and the conversations about prayer, my future homilies, or current events are valuable to me as I am being formed into a future priest.

Finally, I'd like to share what I'll be doing this year in the parish. I have already participated in the cornhole championship during the Fall Festival where Father Bryan and I weren't able to take home the gold, but we had a lot of fun playing. I am teaching the 5th and 6th graders in our religious education program about the sacraments, how they come to us, and their benefit to us for salvation. I will also be writing a monthly bulletin article much like this one, but in the future they will be shorter and I'll speak about my thoughts on an important topic in the church. I'll also be around for the many events at Sacred Heart and hope to get to know all of you that way. Lastly, keep a look out for our new seminarian Quinn Krebs who has been assigned to Sacred Heart for his teaching parish! If you see two seminarians on the altar during the weekend masses don't worry, you're not seeing double.

I feel blessed to have had this teaching parish in which I have learned and taught, prayed and served, and have spoken with many good people. I hope and pray that these next two years will be as great as the last.
