Gratitude

November is traditionally a time to give thanks to God for all we have received. Gratitude is a state of being grateful. It is Thankfulness. Sometimes when eating at an upscale restaurant the menu will note a suggested gratuity or tip. For large parties the gratuity rate is often set and automatically added to the bill. When we give a tip, or gratuity we often do so to acknowledge those who serve for their work and care for us. For a server who has gone over and above our expectation's larger tips, sometimes even greater than the actual bill, are often given.

Our gratitude to God, however, goes beyond the idea of a gratuity or tip. What is there that we can give to God, the creator and sustainer of all things? The prayers of Mass give us an answer in on one of the prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayer – which literally means thanksgiving prayer – in Common Preface IV. It reads: "For, although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness, but profit us for salvation." The very act of giving thanks to God is already His gift to us.

While we can't really give a "tip" to God, God gives us something better in how he redeems us. Through Jesus, our savior, we have been invited to be his disciples, to mold our lives after his image and likeness, to follow Christ. Jesus invites us to embrace the mission. Here at Sacred Heart the following words – Formed in His Heart, Serving with His Heart, Giving from His Heart – are meant to guide us as we embrace His mission for our lives. In the week's ahead during our annual Increased Offertory Program let these words and our mission as disciples guide you in gratitude.

The Meaning of the Family and Motherhood in *Mulieris Dignitatem*

The most important woman who ever lived was not Eve, who though through her we are here, it is the new Eve: Mary the Mother of God. It is hard to express the true importance of a woman at the center of the salvatory event of the incarnation. As Theotokos (Greek meaning: God-Bearer) Mary was the very first to carry Christ within her, not only in a physical way, but in her heart. Saint John Paul II used this beautiful mystery of Mary's motherhood to explain the great importance of motherhood in his 1988 Apostolic letter: *Mulieris Dignitatem*. In this letter, among other things, he spoke of the two distinct ways of being human, the family as *imago Trinitatis* (image of the Trinity), and motherhood with the gift of receptivity.

Saint John Paul II spoke about the two asymmetrical, but full ways of being human those being man and woman. This is important, not only because this affirms the dignity of both men and women, but it also shows that God uses our "manliness" or "womanliness" in order to fulfill his plan for us. The fullest expression of a human is Christ and we are called to be like him. It is important then to first express that you can be conformed to Christ and make it to heaven as either a man or a woman.

When a man and a woman come together in marriage, who both represent the image of God, and they love each other, it is natural for that love between them to result in new life, which is nothing less than another image of the trinity brought forth into the world out of love. John Paul II uses the analogy of the Trinity to describe the family and not the other way around. It is important to note that any analogy we make about the Trinity will be imperfect, since it is the highest mystery of our faith, but John Paul II uses the Trinity as a way to describe the family. The Trinity, as we know, can be described as the Father begetting the Son and the love that they share between them is so strong that a new person proceeds from it, who is the Holy Spirit. So, in this spirit, the family is a community of persons who are called to be givers and receivers. John Paul II says:

"... God himself as Trinity, as a communion of persons. To say that man is created in the image and likeness of God means that man is called to exist "for" others, to become a gift." - (John Paul II: *Mulieris Dignitatem* paragraph no.7)

Finally, the greatest gift of motherhood is receptivity. Mary, in her receptivity and her yes to God's call, bore in her womb the savior of mankind. Women have this very gift: of being generally more receptive than men; this can be seen both in physiological and psychological ways. More than that though, they (women) are all called to be spiritual mothers; being open to God's gifts and the call to guard them. All women are spiritual mothers and some are called to be biological mothers. Both of these things carry with them many graces. This is not to say that receptivity is the same as passivity, in fact, the receptivity of women must be learned by the father in order to know how to be with and care for a child. Without the gift of motherhood to show him the way, the father of a child would have no way of learning how to be a father. Let this special openness seen in motherhood be a witness for all of us in our prayer and in our daily lives, so that we can always be open to God's will for us. In our families let us prize our mothers, but above all take from them the example of what it means to be receptive to the gifts that we are given each and every day.

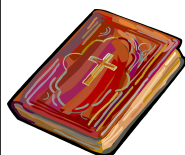

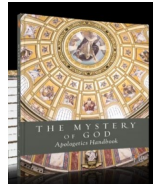

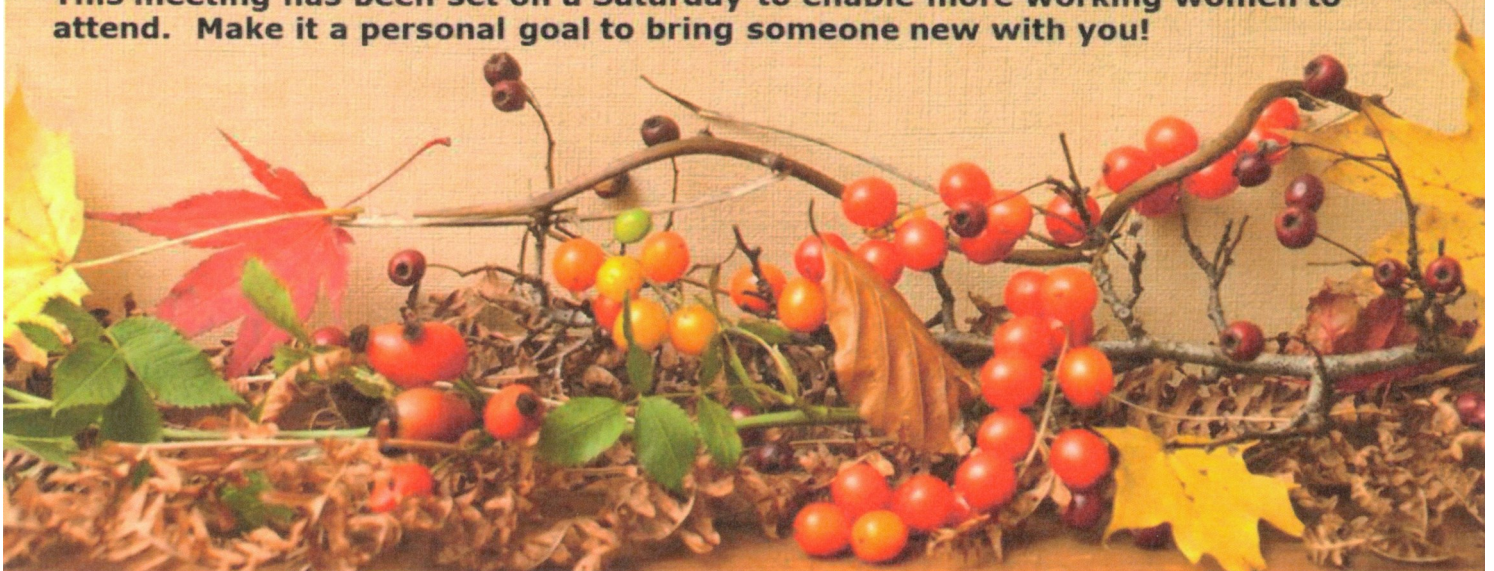
