Questions to Ponder

The results of the recent **Ultimate Question Survey** offered some suggestions on how we can improve in certain areas as well as a number of commendations. We offered highlights in the bulletin the past two weeks for both areas. There were four statements in both areas that were summary in nature, meaning each statement was written to reflect comments appearing from separate individuals that touched on the same themes.

Among the challenges a survey such as this draws out is the possibility of contradictory feelings and sentiments among suggestions for improvements and commendations. In my nearly seventeen years as a priest the nature of contradictory indications most often comes into play in the area of music and liturgy.

Most everyone would agree that they want beautiful and meaningful music for worship, and inspiring liturgical celebrations. The challenge comes in trying to interpret what is beautiful and meaningful. In thinking about these things, there are several questions to consider: What constitutes beauty? If something is beautiful, or pleasing, does that make it suitable for Divine Worship? What is the purpose of the Mass? When it comes to liturgical music, is every style and genre capable of being used? What is the definition of contemporary? What is the definition of traditional? Is it all just a matter of tastes and preferences?

Since Christmas we have been using a Mass setting for the *Gloria* – Glory to God; the *Sanctus* – Holy, Holy, Holy; the *Agnus Dei* – The Lamb of God called *The Mass in Honor of our Lady*. Are these traditional, or contemporary? Let me know what you think.

In the weeks ahead I would like to explore these questions in greater depth and look for answers provided in the various documents and teachings of the Church. The 20th century beginning with Pope St. Pius X and continuing through Pope Francis have all offered teachings about these things. Looking into them can provide us greater depth to think about these questions posed and come to understand what the Catholic Church means by beautiful and meaningful music for Divine Worship.

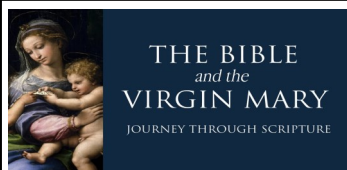

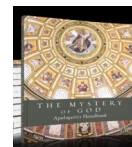


The Bible and the Virgin Mary Journey through the Scriptures Session 3— Wedding at Cana, Garden

In this session, we're going to dive into the famous story of the Wedding at Cana and see how this event in the Gospel of John is directly connected to the events of the Garden of Eden. Through these attributes we discover a God who presses upon the world, always and everywhere, not aggressively but only with love.

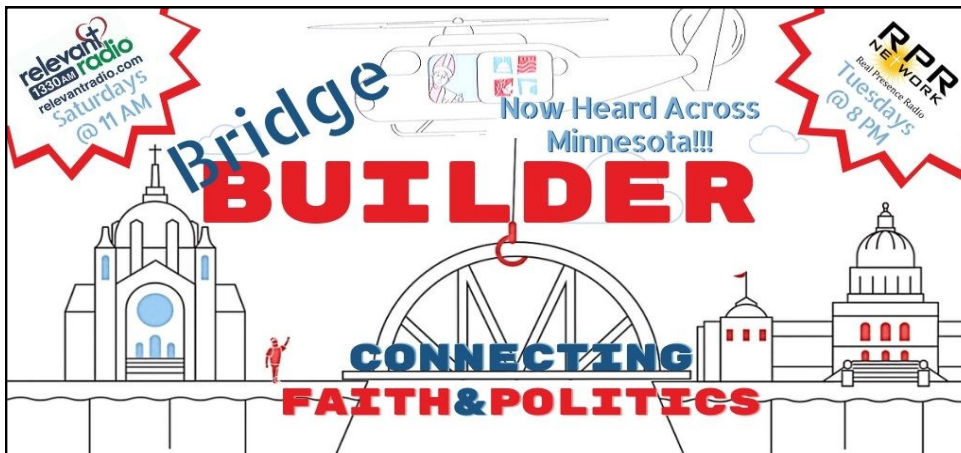

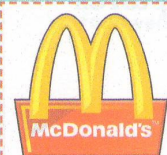
