

Finding Hope When the World is Turned Upside Down or in this Case Closed Down

There is not one person on this entire planet who is unaffected by the Coronavirus Pandemic in some way or another. The call to suspend social gatherings, to stay at home, shift to online learning for schools, to close restaurants and bars and other places of social gathering including Church, the official limiting of who can visit skilled care facilities, nursing homes, and hospitals, not to mention the uncertainty surrounding employment, the economy and the future, has turned the world upside down or in this case closed it down. Even if for a short period of time, this is all devastating for us.

Why are we shutting down? Why are such drastic measures being taken? As a person of faith, I am reminded of the basic truth of human existence found in the first chapter of the Book of Genesis:

"Then God said: Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness.....So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them."

It may seem cliché to say, but every life is sacred. Following the counsel of the experts in infectious deceases our political leaders ers of both parties whether at the national or state level are making decisions to save life from the youngest to the oldest.

This state of affairs is already causing challenges in the short run, including economic displacement, layoffs, etc. Likewise, our spiritual life is affected, as access to the sacramental life is diminished. What can we do during this period of time? How can we keep hope?

First, we remember that God so loved us that He sent His son into this world. He taught us how to live and love as brothers and sisters, children of our heavenly Father. Jesus carried the cross for us, and died for our sake to take away the sins of the world and reconcile us to God. He showed us that not even suffering, and death can conquer the power of God as He rose to life again on the third day. He gave us His body and blood so we may have communion with Him, and He sent us the Holy Spirit to give us the very life of God. Even if we cannot physically be present at Mass we can and must still worship God as best as we can and join our hearts to the Lord for spiritual communion each and every day. I know that when this is over we will be so glad to be packed into Church together as one body in Christ.

Second, even if we don't have easy access to the sacraments or are unable to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass daily or on Sunday, the day of the Lord, we carry that cross for the sake of preserving life. Our worship of God, our self-quarantine, our social distancing, our temporary economic displacements, must all be seen in this light. **We carry this cross to save life!**

Third, it is still the season of Lent, a time of penance we undertake on account of our sins and those of the whole world. This lent the penances we are being given are not of our choosing. Yet, carrying the cross with Jesus while united to His most Sacred Heart we enable us to respond with Faith, Hope, and Love.

As the venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen once said: "Unless there is a Good Friday in your life, there can be no Easter Sunday." So together we are having a collective Good Friday as a nation. As citizens of this great republic we remain united under God remembering that the cross we carry now is to save life, and give Health Care Workers the resources needed to care for all especially the most vulnerable. There will be an Easter Sunday for our nation and our world even if the actual day of Easter this year passes in solitude. Let us hope by April 12th we are able to pack the Church once again!


