Light at the End of the Tunnel

Dear Parishioners,

Last week it seemed like we were very close to being able to resume larger group gatherings in the Church building such as Sunday Mass - while following certain safety protocols - with the end of Gov. Walz's "Stay at Home" executive order on Monday, May 18, 2020. However, as we all learned on May 14th, 2020, Gov. Walz replaced the "Stay at Home" order with the "Stay Safe Minnesota" executive order. This new order effective through June 1, 2020 allows many retail outlets to open including Malls and other shops, yet the same order does not allow restaurants, bars, salons, and other similar businesses to open yet, nor are Churches allowed to have more than 10 people in church buildings for services.

Archbishop Hebda and the Catholic bishops of Minnesota were very saddened by this, as they had put together safety protocols for us to follow assuming that we would be able to use them starting on May 18th, 2020. In order to gain clarity and also communicate to Gov. Walz and public health officials the safety protocols we proposed to be following in a phased reopening, Archbishop Hebda and the other bishops of Minnesota met with the Governor and his team on Tuesday, May 19th, 2020. As of this writing, I have yet to hear what has been decided. As soon as we hear we will send an update via Flocknote.

What is Flocknote? Flocknote is a communication platform that allows Sacred Heart to send group messages through email and texting. Perhaps you have seen some of the short communications I have sent to parishioners who have shared their current email address and cell phone number with the Church office for our database. If you have not received these emails from Sacred Heart Catholic Church and School there are several things you can do.

First, if you don't have an email address, but do have a computer and internet access you can get an email. For our older parishioners you may want to talk with your adult children or grandchildren to help you. Second, if you have an email address that you have already shared with the parish be sure to check your spam or junk folder. Sometimes large group emails will appear there until you tell your inbox program that the sender is safe. In Microsoft Outlook you can create a rule to send emails from Flocknote to your regular inbox, or some other folder. Other services like gmail, yahoo mail, protonmail, hotmail, outlook, thunderbird, or iCloud all have ways to direct mail to where you want it to go. Third, if you have not provided your current email address you can go to our website at shrmn.org and click the <u>Flocknote Updates</u> <u>button</u> on the home page. Doing so will allow you to add your information directly to our Flocknote database. After you have done this just check your email inbox and spam or junk folder for confirmation.

There is light at the end of the tunnel. Perhaps the bishops' meeting with the Governor will result in a modification of his order, or when June 1st arrives a new order will allow us to gather in the Church building once again with groups larger than 10 people. We can all pray for that. We can be safe and worship God! In the meantime check out the livestream on our Facebook page, check out our YouTube channel, or come to a Parking Lot Mass on Sundays at 10am in English, or 11:30am for the Latin Mass. Audio for these masses comes through your car radio at FM 104.9. We have had Mass in all weather conditions. Make it a blessed day!

GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A pair of ducks found their way to the same little corner of the property year after year. Sheltered by a little grove of trees, they quickly made their preparations to build a nest, lay eggs, and welcome in a new family. Then one year, only one of the ducks came to that little corner. She went about the business of building a nest, but this time, she was clearly unsettled. She would wander around, sometimes seemingly without purpose, almost hoping perhaps that her mate might come along. But, she remained alone. There were many times when we could hear her "crying", mourning her loneliness and lack of purpose, sitting on a batch of eggs that would never hatch. One day, she quietly left that little corner never to return again.

Many human beings approach life this way. We silently grieve our loneliness, lack of direction, and sense of purpose. Maybe life once had meaning for us, but nothing seems to claim us and settle our restlessness any longer. We wander around looking and hoping for someone or something to come our way.
