## Pastor's Page Fr. Bryan J.B. Pedersen

#### Sacred Heart Parish Mission Statement

"Sacred Heart Catholic Parish exists to foster a community of disciples in response to the Gospel of Jesus Christ through Worship, Fellowship, Catholic Education and Service"

#### Dear Parishioners,

On Easter Sunday I expressed my great hope that we would be able to gather once again in our Church building for Public Mass by Pentecost. That prayer has been realized. With the new executive order of Gov. Walz our Church can be occupied at 25% capacity. The resumption of public Mass is a great blessing, but there are many protocols we must follow in order to ensure proper safety and social distancing during this stage of the Pandemic. Even though we are not yet back to "normal" progress is being made when it comes to flattening the curve, and ensuring our health care system is not overwhelmed. During this next phase of reopening a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains.

In order to promote safety and the practice of our faith for all in our community we are taking a multi-pronged approach which will include Masses within Church at no greater than 25% seating capacity. To ensure we do not exceed this seating capacity we will have an online Mass signup. Our Weekend Masses in Church will include a 4:00pm Vigil Mass on Saturday, and our usual Sunday morning schedule of 8am, 10am, and 11:30am. Our Masses in English will most likely be between 30-40 minutes in length. We will follow all the recommended protocols which means at this time we will not have congregational singing. We will follow certain protocols regarding distribution of Holy Communion. We will follow social distancing protocols meaning some pews will be roped off. We ask those attending to wear a mask for the benefit of others. We will disinfect pews and other highly touched surfaces before and after each Mass. At the most opportune time we will employ a fogging mist to disinfect the entire space.

To assist those who may be in a higher risk group from the Covid-19 Virus we will also maintain at this time at least one parking lot Mass in the West Broadway Lot. This Mass will take place Saturday evening at 5:30pm and will be approximately 30 minutes in length. Holy Communion will be offered as part of this Mass.

There will be some in our community who are not comfortable in groups larger than ten. To accommodate their spiritual needs we will continue to have Holy Communion Appointments of no more than 10 persons per appointment available once a week for a two hour period from 4:00-6:00 PM on Wednesdays.

Look to your email inbox for Flocknote messages from Sacred Heart for the latest information including our Safety Protocols document. We will be refining our implementation of the various Archdiocesan directives and directives from the Minnesota Department of Health as we move forward. Recourse to our parish website, Facebook page, and Flocknote communications will be very important as we continue to cope with the Covid-19 Virus Pandemic. I ask for your prayers for our parish, our Catholic School and all of our employees who are working very diligently to continue our parish life while striving to keep all who come to our campus safe.



#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION** Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

You can feel so small standing by the seashore. The vastness of all that is before you expands much farther than your eye can see. What is happening on the other side? As tides continue to ebb and flow, what occurs as they come and go remains largely a mystery and the effects of their presence unknown in your sight. Yet, things are moving and changing as you gaze upon the water, as the thumbprint of their presence is left behind. The greater the wind and wave, the greater the effect. But even a gentle breeze leaves its humble mark upon the seashore on which you stand. The smallest pebble still makes a ripple in the great blue expanse of ocean waters. It doesn't need to be big.

You never know the full impact of your smallest gesture or simplest of words. A yes or no, agree or disagree, here or there, this or that can influence time and history in ways you may never know. The Holy Spirit is like that: fierce and torrential, and then almost still and silent, creating and recreating nonetheless. Coming as a gentle breeze or a gusty wind, God's Holy Spirit continues to move over, around, and into the waters of our lives. The Spirit brings fruit and unknown possibilities to what we humbly bring with us and that same Spirit eventually brings all to fulfillment in Christ.

The first disciples didn't have much. They possessed simple faith and a willingness to go into unchartered territory with a love of their friend-God, humble offerings, and a knowledge that they were not alone. This allowed them to do amazing things with very little. Do you believe that you are being led and that you have a purposeful life? We often do not realize our value because we do not think that the little we have is good enough. How wrong we are! A little flour mixed with water and embraced by a prayer of blessing transforms simple offerings into the magnificent Eucharistic presence of God. If the Holy Spirit can do such amazing things with these humble gifts of the earth, even more can happen with you. Don't underestimate the value of the smile you gave a stranger, the door held open for an elderly widow, the listening ear offered to one who was lonely, the tolerance given to the wounded soul who is angry, and the loving shoulder you offered as a cradle under the head of someone in pain. Modest gifts offered with love can be transformed by the Spirit into wondrous blessings you may never know. It's Pentecost. Trust. You are not alone.




