

## Pastor's Page Fr. Bryan J.B. Pedersen

Dear Parishioners,

In the appointed Gospel for today we hear about the brothers of the Lord. Who are these brothers? Don't we hold that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was perpetually a virgin, and never had relations with St. Joseph?

If Jesus had biological brothers, then Catholic belief held since the Apostolic age in the first century would be wrong. And yet that can't be so for the Catholic Church guided by the Holy Spirit ensures that the Church's magisterium -the official teaching authority of the Church - does not fall into formal error or heresy in regard to her interpretation of the Sacred Scriptures aka The Holy Bible.

How do we answer those who question us about the Blessed Virgin Mary? There are two explanations going back to the earliest century of Christianity which also uphold the teaching on the perpetual virginity of St. Mary, the mother of God.

The first concerns the term "brothers" and the range of meaning it has in both the Aramaic and Greek languages. For example the Greek word "adelphos" which is translated as brother can refer to biological siblings, but also can refer to cousins, or close relatives as when Abram refers to his nephew Lot as a brother.

"So Abram said to Lot, "Let's not have any quarreling between you and me, or between your herdsmen and mine, for we are brothers." Genesis 13:8

Matt Fradd, a popular Catholic teacher and lay evangelist, also puts it this way:

"Because of the Bible's broad semantic range of "brother," we can rest assured that although St. Paul writes, "[Jesus] appeared to more than five hundred... brothers at the same time" (1 Cor. 15:6), we need not infer from this verse that Mary gave birth to more than 500 children!"

Another explanation coming circa A.D. 150 of the second century in a writing called the *Protoevangelium of James* "speaks of Mary as a consecrated virgin since her youth, and of St. Joseph as an elderly widower with children who was chosen to be Mary's spouse for the purposes of guarding and protecting her while respecting her vow of virginity. Though this document is not on the level of Sacred Scripture, it was written very early, and it may contain accurate historical traditions."

The most important part of the Gospel today is the words Jesus speaks in response to those who told him his mother and brothers were waiting for him outside where he was teaching when he responds the messenger while stretching out his hands toward his disciples:

"Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of my heavenly Father is my brother, and sister, and mother." Matthew 12:49-50

#### Sacred Heart Catholic School

#### Our plan for Sacred Heart Catholic School is to open for in-person learning on September 8<sup>th</sup>

We have two Task Force teams of parents, teachers, and staff that are busy planning this month. Our safety task force is planning health and safety protocols for the return of students/staff. Our academic task force is planning three learning scenarios; in-person, hybrid and online learning. We are taking reopening of our school very seriously. We have been in an empty building too long without our students, and it will be a great joy to our community to be reunited in person again!

#### A few plans for in-person learning:

- 1. Students, K-5, will be self-contained in their classroom during the day except for recess/lunch. Students, 6-8, will also be self-contained in a classroom, and the middle school team will travel to the students.
- 2. Specialists will travel to the classroom and/or have classes outside such as gym.
- 3. Desks will be spaced farther apart to meet social distancing recommendations. Visual cues will be in place to protect the health and safety of students and staff.
- 4. Students will have their temperatures checked as they enter the building using notouch thermometers and a visual symptom check. All students will wash their hands before entering the classroom and at various times throughout the day. Hand sanitizer will be available in the classrooms when hand washing is not possible.
- 5. Students will have recess every day with limited number of students outside at a time.
- 6. Cleaning and sanitizing protocols will be in place.

#### A few plans for hybrid and online learning:

With limited time for planning for online learning last spring, our teachers developed a very successful online learning plan for each grade, PreK-8<sup>th</sup> grade. We revised our plans at mid-term and overall, parents were pleased. After completing a parent survey, we have further strengthened our plans for this fall to ensure a successful online learning plan that meets our high academic standards.

- 1. Middle school students will have a set daily schedule to follow. Teachers will be "live" during each class period for instruction and support.
- 2. Grades 4-5 will also have a set daily schedule with a mix of "live" lessons along with small group meetings for differentiated instruction.
- 3. Grades K-3 will have a weekly Learning Board to post assignments for the week with "live" and small group instruction.
- 4. Specific age-appropriate online learning expectations are now in place to help maximize learning.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

#### **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

A single mother who has a child with special needs works two jobs and sacrifices much of her own pleasures in order to be available for her son. Being the best mother possible is important to her and brings her joy. We are willing to make great and often heroic sacrifices for those people and things that matter most to us. Unless there is something of obvious importance to us in our immediate path, we can easily approach life in a more haphazard and chaotic way. We jump from one thing to another, responding to whatever it is that is competing for our attention at that moment. When everything is important, nothing is important.

If we do not wear the right pair of glasses, we can get all too easily caught up in the superficial stuff and neglect paying attention to the things that really matter. The kingdom of God is like the pearl of great price that is worth selling everything for so that it can be obtained. Based on where I invest my time and energy each day, I really wonder whether I am serving God's kingdom or my own. Have you ever considered tracking how you spend your time? You may be surprised! We allow our agendas to set the clock of our lives. We forget that joy and a true sense of purpose are not going to be found in following that timepiece. Joy is the expression of the happiness that is discovered when living in the kingdom of God. When our agenda matches God, not only do we leap for joy but God leaps with delight as well. Our well-being is what matters most to God.

Can you imagine God delighting in you? It is easy to deaden our senses to the whole reality of God and the joy that living the Gospel can bring. The demands of secular life and the agendas competing for our attention can quickly do that. We can get tired and spiritually apathetic. But if we can see our way through all of the conflicting voices and hear the voice of God, we can rediscover our zeal and passion and redirect our efforts. When we begin to see as God sees, we can rise each day and notice what really needs our attention and embrace it with exuberance. Be careful, though. It may not be what we originally had on our list. Responding to it, however, will be worth putting everything else aside.
