Martha and Mary

The final weeks of July have two saints of note that are connected. On July 22^{nd,} the Church remembers St. Mary Magdalene. Seven days later, on July 29th, the octave day the Church remembers St. Martha. The placement of their feast days eight days apart in the Latin Church suggest they are the sisters mentioned in the tenth chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke.

However, there are conflicts between various traditions of the Church in the West, and the Church in the East. The Church in the West has come to be known as the Catholic Church whereas the Church in the East has come to be known as the Orthodox Church. We should remember however that prior to A.D. 1054 there was one Church, East and West, united together. As the Nicene Creed puts it: I believe...in One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.

In the west Martha of Bethany and Mary Magdalene are identified as being the sisters of Lazarus of Bethany, the man whom Jesus raised from the dead after his decaying body had already been in the tomb for four days as recorded in the Gospel according to St. John. According to an early thirteenth century medieval tradition found in the famous Golden Legend they eventually evangelized the area around Provence and southern Gaul. Lazarus becomes bishop of Marseilles. He is said to be martyred during a persecution begun by the emperor Domitian in the latter part of his reign between A.D. 89-96 and originally buried in Auton. Mary Magdalene is said to have gone to a Grotto for thirty years of penance, and at least two places in Southern France claim to have her relics. Martha is said to end up in Tarascon, France, but was also said to be in Avignon.

Yet there is another tradition stemming from the east or the Byzantine Greek Church that Mary, the sister of Martha was not Mary Magdalene, but Mary of Bethany. Together Martha and Mary of Bethany are commemorated in the Greek Liturgical Calendar on June 4th. These three siblings ultimately go to Cyprus. Lazarus is said to be the appointed the bishop of Kition, Cyprus by St. Paul and Barnabas. His tomb was said to be lost, but in 890 A.D., a marble sarcophagus bearing the inscription 'Lazarus, four days dead, friend of Christ' was discovered in Larnaca known as Kition in the first century.

So which tradition is right? Is St. Mary Magdalene also St. Mary of Bethany, or are they two separate people? Is there a way for both traditions to be right? I am not sure. Perhaps there was a St. Mary Magdalene who had a sister named Martha, and a brother named Lazarus who all end up in the south of France. Or perhaps there are two sisters Martha and Mary as found in the Gospel of St. Luke who neither lived in Bethany nor had a brother named Lazarus. Perhaps there is another Martha and Mary who are the sisters of a different Lazarus who all lived in Bethany. So why is there so much confusion?

Stephen D. Greydanus writing in the National Catholic Register on May 1st, 2019 notes that "Mary was an extremely common name; in first-century Palestine close to half of all Jewish women were named either Mary or Salome!" Perhaps this explains everything, or perhaps it explains nothing. This may just be one of those questions that will only be answered on the other side of eternity.

FACE COVERING MANDATE

Face Covering Mandate: Churches are not exempt from the new face-covering mandate of Gov. Walz. Children 5 and under are exempt, as are those for whom wearing a mask poses medical complications to existing conditions. Those having a speaking role such as the priest, deacon, lector, etc. are exempt. Non-compliance could result in \$1,000 fine for Sacred Heart, or \$100 fine for an individual. 


