
Eucharistic Adoration

Vigilance

With the counsel of public health officials, governmental mandates, and Archdiocesan protocols we have adopted several practices in public spaces during this pandemic out of abundance of caution. While actions such frequently as hands and coughing on the inside of our elbow have always been advisable and common sense, newer practices such as social distancing, increased use of hand sanitizing stations, reducing the occupancy of indoor public spaces, more frequent disinfecting of those spaces, and now mask wearing while indoors have been asked of us for the benefit of public health and the common good during the pandemic.

While there are divergent voices about the best way to respond to the pandemic, and even different practices by region, state, or country respect for duly constituted public authority has been a staple of Catholic Social Teaching for two millennia. The Catechism of the Catholic Church offers a summary of this teaching in section 1897-1927 which is worth reviewing.

Because the pandemic has lasted so long there is always the risk that we become lackadaisical about the safety protocols. To that end, it is important to renew our vigilance for these practices out of charity and respect for one another. Even if you are unconvinced that wearing masks and/or social distancing is an effective response to the pandemic at this time the blessed apostle St. Paul advises us in several letters the importance of not becoming a stumbling block for others. Cf. 1 Cor. 10:23-33; or Romans 14.

Let me note a couple things that will help us to exercise charity for one another while avoiding becoming a stumbling block to others.

Use and observe the Sign-Up for Sunday Mass.

If you have forgotten the slot you signed up for please check in with the Usher who will direct, you to your place.

If by chance you did not sign-up for Mass, before taking a slot check-in with the usher to ensure the slot is free.

Remember common courtesy means not taking a slot someone else may have reserved.

Observe the mask mandate unless you are exempt.

If by chance you forgot your mask, we do have them available. Check in with the usher or the reception desk in the parish common for a mask.

Wearing the mask properly requires it to be over the nose and face.

If an usher offers you a mask, please make use of it, or communicate to them you are exempt.

Make it a blessed day!

REMINDER: FACE COVERING MANDATE

Face Covering Mandate: Churches are not exempt from the new face-covering mandate of Gov. Walz. Children 5 and under are exempt, as are those for whom wearing a mask poses medical complications to existing conditions. Those having a speaking role such as the priest, deacon, lector, etc. are exempt. "Masks should cover both nose and month unless this causes some hardship related to breathing or you are exempt from the mask mandate". Non-compliance could result in \$1,000 fine for Sacred Heart, or \$100 fine for an individual. Regardless of your feeling pro or con regarding face coverings please observe this executive order when coming inside the buildings of Sacred Heart Catholic Church.

You will be required to sign-up for a pew slot in either the Main Church or Chapel prior to the week-end Masses. Each pew slot can hold up to (4) people in the same family. Question:

Why are only men allowed to be priests or deacons in the Church?

Answer:

One of the most debated and — in some circles — contentious teachings of the Church is that only men can be ordained as priests and deacons. Critics see it as a way of strengthening a patriarchal system in which women have little or no voice. Those who support this teaching look to New Testament teaching (where we read of Jesus choosing only men to be apostles) and the long-standing practice of the Church. This was certainly the perspective of St. John Paul II who, in his 1994 apostolic letter, Ordinatio Sacerdotalis, closed the discussion on the possibility of ordaining women as priests.

In the letter, he reflected on the dignity of women and their call to share in the life and mission of the Church, but he concluded by solemnly declaring that "the Church has no authority whatsoever to confer priestly ordination on women and that this judgement is to be definitely held by all the Church's faithful" (no. 4).

This position has been upheld by Pope Francis in interviews, most notably as he returned from his 2016 visit to Sweden.

The ordination of women to the diaconate is another question and one which is being studied. In 2016, Pope Francis created a 12-member commission to study the question from several perspectives (theological, liturgical, historical, etc.). The commission issued an initial report for Pope Francis who later said that the commission had not yet produced a "definite response" to the question because of a lack of agreement on the role of female deacons in the Early Church.

For now, however, regardless of what changes might come from ongoing study and debate, the Church continues to reserve ordination to the diaconate to men only, recognizing a vital link between the diaconate and the priesthood and the lack of certainty about the presence and function of female deacons throughout history.




