Christmas in The Year of St. Joseph

You may have heard recently that Pope Francis called for a year dedicated to St. Joseph which began on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8th, 2020. It should delight us all that Pope Francis was following the lead of our own Archbishop, who earlier this year declared that he would consecrate the Archdiocese and the future Archdiocesan Synod to the patronage of St. Joseph.

Archbishop wrote to us priests earlier this year inviting us to participate in the Archdiocesan Year of St. Joseph:

"The second event is a formal opening to the Archdiocesan Year of St. Joseph, which will begin on Tuesday, December 8, 2020, the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pius IX's declaration of St. Joseph as the Universal Patron of the Church. Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral of St. Paul at 7:00 a.m. and all would be welcome to participate, whether in-person or virtually (the Mass will be live-streamed and available at the Archdiocese's Events page). In the course of the Mass, we will be offering a special prayer consecrating the Archdiocese to St. Joseph, especially in this second year of our Synod preparations.

Throughout the 2020- 2021 liturgical year, there will be other opportunities to reinforce our reliance upon St. Joseph, individually and as a Church. Recognizing that these are extraordinary times, and that there is already much on your plate, the expectation is that the Year of St. Joseph would be a spiritual consolation for you, rather than adding to your responsibilities. May he, who guarded the Blessed Virgin Mary and her Divine Son, also bring you and our Archdiocese into the fullness of all that our loving God desires to bestow upon us!"

As we celebrate the season of Christmas this year reflecting on the role that St. Joseph played in the Nativity story will aid our own spiritual participation in Christmas. St. Joseph, the righteous and just man was given a great responsibility. He was chosen by God to be the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, and the foster-father and guardian of Jesus, the Son of God. To St. Joseph was given the task of protecting and defending the Holy Family. St. Joseph was given the responsibility of naming the child to be born. St. Joseph was given the responsibility of modeling human fatherhood to Jesus. From St. Joseph Jesus, in his human nature, learned many things. He learned what it meant to live in the covenant of Abraham. He learned how to observe the great festivals of the Jewish Liturgical year. He learned from St. Joseph the importance and dignity of work. He learned from St. Joseph how men should relate to women as he observed how St. Joseph related to St. Mary and others. He learned his trade of carpentry from St. Joseph. There are so many other things Jesus, in his humanity, would have learned from St. Joseph. The divine nature of Jesus delighted in this process, just as God delights in us as we learn the paths of virtue and righteousness from holy and good people God has placed in our lives.

Perhaps the most important things we can learn from St. Joseph is how to listen and trust in the God. St. Joseph, no doubt, had a plan for his life which was altered greatly when he learned the St. Mary was pregnant with child. Yet St. Joseph always strove to be just. His heart was open to the inspiration of God. He listened to the message he received in a dream from an angel and trusted in that message. It forever changed his life. That change brought him the greatest joy imaginable. It was not always easy, and embracing this call would lead to challenges, even suffering, yet God was with him every step of the way.

May St. Joseph assist us in learning how to listen to the voice of God and trust in the divine plan God has for our lives. When we do so, just like St. Joseph, we too will find great happiness, and, yes, God will be with us, every step of the way!



Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. Their simple humble example is always before us, showing us the way. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!




