The Path of Love and Non-violence

This past week on inauguration day, the Gospel of the day taken from St. Mark 3:1-6 recounted the miraculous healing of man who had a withered hand. We are told Jesus performed this miracle on the Sabbath Day in a Synagogue. We can infer that Jesus healed this man in the manner he did to challenge the religious establishment of his own day. Witnesses of this miraculous healing were Pharisees who, as St. Mark notes, "watched Jesus closely to see if he would cure him on the Sabbath so that they might accuse him." It is hard for us today to understand how anyone could see that a miraculous healing could somehow be a violation of the third commandment of the law to "Keep holy the Sabbath day." Yet, it was this miraculous healing that definitively set the pharisees against Jesus. What was their issue? It was the teaching of the Pharisees, a teaching widely held in Jesus' day, that even to heal on the Sabbath was a kind of "work" that violated the Sabbath Day rest.

Before performing this work of healing Jesus challenged the establishment with these words: "Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath rather than to do evil to save life rather than to destroy it?" Bishop Barron notes that "his healings signify the arrival of the kingdom of God. When Jesus began to preach, his theme was that the kingdom of God is at hand. In his own person an entirely new way of ordering things was on offer. Then—in his love and nonviolence, in his confrontation with the Pharisees and religious establishment, in his healing and teaching—Jesus was demonstrating precisely what the reign of the God of Israel looks like."

The Gospel tells us that after this event "The Pharisees went out and immediately took counsel with the Herodians against him to put him to death." The Herodians were a group of Jews who sought to advance the political authority of King Herod Antipas.

The path of love and non-violence which Jesus shows us as he strives to affect social change is a slower path to be sure but leads to lasting results because this way has the capacity to change hearts and minds. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., a Christian preacher and pastor took this same approach in effecting social change in regard to civil rights. This approach contrasts with the pharisees who sought to use political power to try and extinguish those opposed to them like Jesus. There are many lessons we can draw applicable to our own day in so many ways.
