BLESSING OF AN ADVENT WREATH

Gathering around the table where the advent wreath has been placed one of the parents leads the family in prayer. Another member of the family may read the scripture lesson. The candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and the number of candles lighted each week corresponds to the number of the current week of Advent. The rose candle is lighted on the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday. The Advent wreath candle should be lit as the leader begins.

All make the Sign of the Cross as the leaders says:

☼ Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Ry Who made heaven and earth.

Then the scripture is read. (Isaiah 9:1-2, 5-6)

Listen to the words of the Prophet Isaiah:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing. As they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as men make merry when dividing spoils.

For a child is born to us, a son in given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, from David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms and sustains by judgment and justice, both now and forever.

The Word of the Lord.

R Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God, we praise you for your son Jesus Christ: He is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, He is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, He is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May He come quickly and not delay.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. R Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel"


