Homo Liturgicus

Just prior to Lent I took my annual canonical retreat. It is called "canonical" since by the law of the Church those is Sacred Orders – Deacons, Priests, and Bishops are required to take an annual retreat. I must confess I had missed a couple of years.

You are probably familiar with certain terms such as Homo Erectus, or Homo Sapiens. The word homo is the Latin word for Man. Erectus meaning stands for a creature that walks on two legs, upright, or erect. Sapiens relates to the Latin word for wisdom – sapientia. So Home Sapiens means a human being capable of reasoning. I heard the term Homo Liturgicus while listening to a talk of Dr. John Bergsma, a professor of Scripture and Theology at Franciscan University, Steubenville, Ohio. During the retreat our meals were had in silence for Breakfast and Lunch. Talking was allowed at Dinner. During the earlier meals we listened to portions of a recorded talk title "Are priests biblical?"

Dr. Bergsma made the point that Adam was the first priest. He made this argument based upon the tasks given him in the Garden of Eden.

As noted in the book of Genesis 2:15

"The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till (Heb. work) it and keep (Heb. guard) it."

These same tasks were given to the Sons of Levi. In the time of the Exodus, the Levites are officially made the priests of Israel.

As noted in the book Numbers 3:6-7

"Bring the tribe of Levi near, and set them before Aaron the priest, that they may minister to him. They shall perform duties (Heb. guard the things to be guarded) for him and for the whole congregation before the tent of meeting, as they minister (Heb. work the work) at the tabernacle."

The phrase Homo Liturgicus used by Dr. Bergsma relates to the idea that the cosmos was made to manifest the glory of God, and that the Garden of Eden was the original Temple.

I could delve deeper into what Dr. Bergsma shared, but time is fleeting and the bulletin deadline approaches. As we continue in the season of Lent consider for a moment that essential to the human purpose is the necessity to worship. We are made to worship to God. For Christians Jesus is our High Priest, and those men ordained to the ministerial priesthood, or in Holy Orders share in the priesthood of Christ as Head and Shepherd. Yet all Christian share in what is known as the common priesthood of faithful since our baptism makes us members of the mystical Body of Christ. Only through the priesthood of Jesus can we worship God with justice and righteousness.

Since we all share in common priesthood we can ask ourselves the following questions? What is it that God has asked me to guard, and in what is it that God has asked me to cultivate or till? In other words how can I make my ordinary work holy, such that it becomes The Work of God participating in the idea that the human person is not just Homo Sapiens, but Homo Liturgicus.
