Dear Parishioners,

It seems like a long time since we bid farewell to Jeffrey Patry, our former director of Sacred Music who took a new position at First Lutheran Church in Columbia Heights in October of 2019. We were blessed to have him for eighteen years. After Jeff's departure I felt it wise that there would be a little gap between him and the one who would succeed him. And so we had Helen and David Jensen serve as interim organists through 2019, and then Jim Frazier beginning in early 2020.

The formal process to hire a new director began early in 2020. On March 15th, 2020 we had two interviews, and then the lockdown began on March 19th, 2020. I suspended the process at that point since adding someone to our payroll on a full-time basis seemed imprudent with so much uncertainty and the inability for our congregation to gather together in person for Sunday Mass and worship. When we were again able to worship in person there were restrictions in regard to music and so we left the position vacant. We brought music back to our worship with cantor and organist beginning in Christmas 2020 even while some restrictions still remained. Jim Frazier assisted us again through April of 2021. These last two months Joseph Clarke and Jeff Patry helped fill the gap with our cantors while the process of hiring a new director was resumed a full year after it had been suspended due to COVID. In April and May we held interviews, and I made a job offer in early June which, all praise be to God, was accepted.

I can now announce that our new Director of Sacred Music will begin her duties at the Church of the Sacred Heart on July 6th, 2021. Please welcome Jamie Schmidt, Iowa born and raised, beginning her work in Church Music in Middle School when she began taking lessons from a Religious Sister who was organist and choir director at her childhood parish, to The Church of the Sacred Heart.

Jamie Schmidt has provided a short biography I would like to share with you this weekend. Please welcome her to our Sacred Heart Parish community, and consider how God has blessed you with musical talents to give glory to God and lead others to experience His beauty, truth, and goodness through Divine Worship. You may receive a call or a tap on the shoulder in the future to give back to the Lord what He has given you.

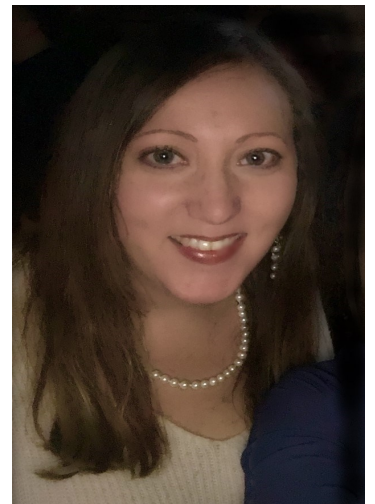

Sacred Heart Catholic School



Did you know that in America today, the number of students who are not reading at grade-level by 3rd grade is 60%?

As many parents know, if children don't become fluent readers by the end of 3rd grade, they will have a difficult time catching up. The average number of struggling K-3 readers in our Catholic school system is close to 25%, and we will not be satisfied until all of our students are fluent readers and achieving all that God intends for them.

To address this, Sacred Heart Catholic School is one of nearly 50 schools in the Archdiocese partnering with Groves Academy, a national expert in reading instruction, to transform our literacy instruction. The program is called Believe and Read.

Powered by the Catholic Schools Center of Excellence, Believe and Read is a three-year initiative that brings Groves Academy's methodology to Sacred Heart Catholic School through outstanding professional development and teacher coaching. Our goal is to ensure that every student at our school reads at or above grade level.

All students who participate in Believe and Read will benefit—struggling readers become proficient, and good readers become great ones!

How Believe and Read works:

- ♦ Literacy coaches from Groves Academy will work with our teachers, K-3, over a three year period.
- ♦ In addition to building students' vocabulary and comprehension skills through their regular reading lessons, teachers will incorporate a daily 30-minute phonics-based lesson to ensure students are grasping the reading rules needed to achieve fluency.
- ♦ Lessons are designed so that teachers will know exactly how and when to introduce each letter, along with its sounds, and how to build up words from there.
- ♦ Teachers will receive weekly support and feedback from a professional literacy coach, along with assistance in tracking progress.

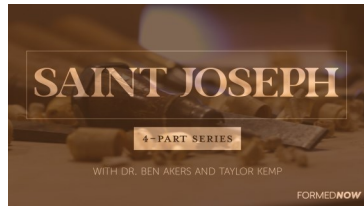

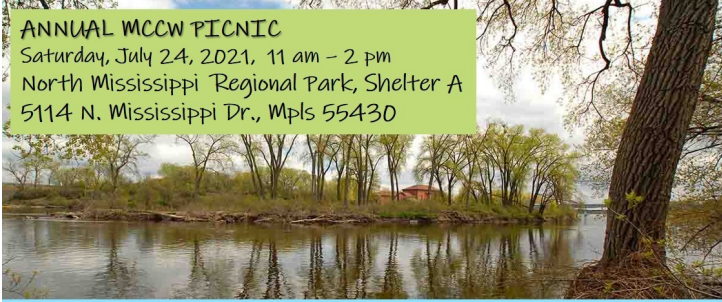

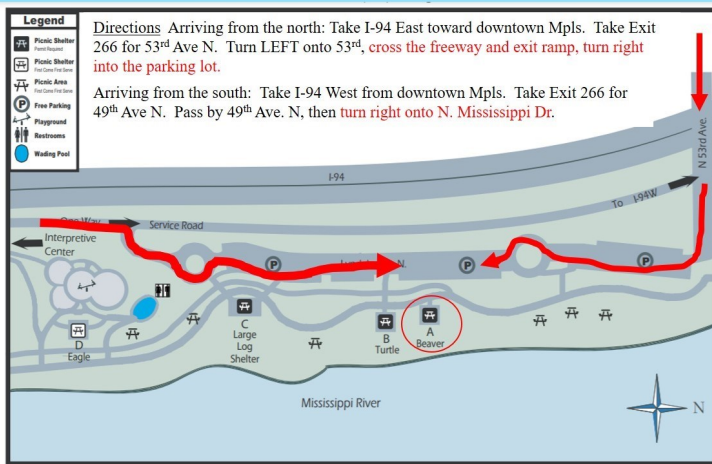

Why Do Catholics Do That?

Question: Our Catholic grade school is doing a penance service this Lent. Do young children really need to go to Confession? How much sin can they really have?

Answer:

Ask any mom about her children and see how many would say she has a brood of perfect angels! Parents know that kids do things that are wrong ... and they often know they're doing it! Even toddlers have a sense of right and wrong. The Church recognizes that their minds and consciences are not yet fully developed, however, and typically waits until age seven to offer the sacrament of Confession. Around that age and beyond, most young people, when asked, can easily explain why something is wrong.

Confession for children is an excellent way to help them reflect on their actions and accept responsibility for their behavior. It helps them to grow in their understanding of sin and how it affects others. This helps them to form their consciences and make better choices in the future. Most importantly, they learn the value of forgiveness, both given and received. Rather than singling out what's wrong, Confession offers hope and a new start! Children can grow in understanding God's unconditional love and develop a sense of inner dignity that transcends their failings. Not bad for five minutes and an "Our Father" or two!
