GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

“Far be it from us to forsake the Lord for the service of other gods.” We struggle with our gods. They appear in the forms of things like money, power, prestige, popularity, privilege, and self-fulfillment. We like these “gods” because they make us feel good and ask very little of us in return. When we worship them, we worship ourselves. How can you go wrong with that? We buy into the illusion that if something can give us a comfortable life, free of want and need, then it is worth setting other things aside to pursue it. In essence, we sell our souls. Our struggle with “who is God” and to whom do we belong is a real one and one that can easily find us empty and experiencing disillusionment.

The devil tempted Jesus in the desert and promised him more. We are promised “more.” But in pursuing the more and the satisfying we lose track of the cost, and the cost is great. We sacrifice our very life in pursuit of something disguised as life. We sacrifice truth for something that only “feels” true. While the true and real God certainly promises us many things, many things are also required. It is not about the warm and secure feelings and self-absorption the world wants to provide, but of giving back. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God’s kingdom (not our own), love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, that we must die to ourselves in order to find ourselves, and trust that Jesus truly gives us his flesh and blood to eat and drink. These are hard things to accept and even harder to put into practice. It is no wonder that many, who may be attracted to Jesus at first, walk away in pursuit of the more self-satisfying gods.

But truth is truth. If we cannot accept it from the lips of Jesus Christ, then where else will we find it? To whom can we go? There is only one source of truth and life, Jesus Christ. Jesus has the words of eternal life and if we do not go to him, then where else will we find this gift? But we must be faithful and buy into the whole package deal that requires sacrifice and fidelity. When we do, we find ourselves, through the Body and Blood of Christ, connected to the Source of all life and then intimately bound with our brothers and sisters. We all have to decide whether we want to stay or go and if we can accept what Jesus has to say. It’s a choice we all have to make.

Sacred Heart Catholic School



Sacred Heart Catholic School begins 3rd year of our reading initiative called Believe and Read.

Groves Academy is visionary in changing the way children learn to read, paving the way for successfully reading to learn. Through our partnership with CSCOE and Groves, students learn to read and spell using a curriculum based on the science of reading. In K-3, teachers incorporate a daily 30-minute phonics lesson to ensure students are grasping the necessary reading rules. Students also “sky write” and tap their fingers to reinforce calisthenic, auditory and visual components of reading to build better connections in the brain. Teachers collect reading data on their students and provide additional instruction to students who struggle. In addition to a weekly classroom coaching sessions by a Groves literacy coach, all teachers attend a variety of Groves professional development workshops to increase their depth of knowledge.

Are you looking for a school where teachers create a positive learning environment focusing on our C-STEM curriculum, a new phonics reading initiative called Believe & Read for PreK-3rd grade, and a strong foundation in our Catholic faith and proven academic success?

Why Do We Do That?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

Answer: The role of the Church in the world has taken different forms over time, but the theme is the same. Be disciples in it! As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, “In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God” (On the Lay Members of Christ’s Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we’re there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The same holds for God. Either we serve God, or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood. For some, buying into these things may prove too difficult and a return to a life without them is preferred. But truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we go to find it? The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship



- There will be a time limit on games. If a game hits 10 minutes that game will stop at the 10 minute mark and the winner will be the team with the highest points.

1 The Setup

- 1.1 Two boxes shall be set up such that their fronts face each other and their hole centers are 30 feet apart.
- 1.2 There exists an imaginary line that continues in either direction from the front of the playing surface, termed the foot foul line.



2 Game Play

- 2.1 Two teams of two people, termed partners, shall play. Partners shall stand at opposite boxes on the same side, from the perspective of a third person, and face each other, so there is no advantage given to one team.
- 2.2 Each team shall have 4 bags of one color.
- 2.3 All 8 bags begin at one end.
- 2.4 A coin flip shall determine who has honors in round one.
- 2.5 One of the partners on the team who has honors shall begin play by throwing a bag at the opposite box.
- 2.6 A player may throw from anywhere behind the foot foul line.
- 2.7 Game continues by alternating throws between the two opponent players until all 8 bags have been thrown.
- 2.8 If a bag hits the ground then bounces up onto the board, that bag shall be taken off the playing surface.
- 2.9 Refer to section 4 for scoring and honors.
- 2.10 The next round starts when the other player on the team, which has honors, throws their first bag.
- 2.11 **The game continues until one team reaches 21 or more points.**

3 Fouls

- 3.1 A foul occurs when any of the following happens.
 - 5.1.1 A player's foot goes past the foot foul line, termed a foot foul.
 - 5.1.2 A player goes out of turn.The player who caused the foul loses the throw when the foul occurred and the bag shall be removed if it landed on the playing surface.


4 Scoring

- 4.1 The score shall be taken after all bags have been thrown for a round.
- 4.2 Points shall be given as follows.
 - 4.2.1 Three points for a bag that goes through the hole.
 - 4.2.2 One point for a bag that is on the playing surface.
 - 4.2.3 One point for a bag that is hanging into the hole.
 - 4.2.4 One point for a bag that is hanging off the edge but not touching the ground.
 - 4.2.5 Zero points for a bag that is on the playing surface, but also touching the ground.
 - 4.2.6 Zero points for a bag that is hanging off the front edge and is resting on a bag that is on the ground, unless the bag on the ground can be removed without making the hanging bag fall to the ground, then one point is given.
- 4.3 Each team is given a round score according to section 4.2. The team with the highest round score, adds the difference of the two scores to their game score.
- 4.4 The team who wins the round is given honors to throw first in the next round.
- 4.5 If both teams have the same round score then the game score stays the same and honors stays with the team who had it the previous round.
- 4.6 The following is a possible scoring turn:
 - 1st throw: Team A throws and it lands on the ramp, team B throws and it goes through the hole.
 - 2nd throw: A goes through hole, B lands on ramp.
 - 3rd throw: A lands on ramp knocking team B's 2nd throw into hole, B lands on the ground. 4th throw: A lands on ramp, B lands on ramp knocking A's 1st throw onto ground. A gets 5 pts and B gets 7 for the round, so B adds 7-5 = 2 pts to their game score and has honors for the next round.
