Sacred Heart Parish Mission Statement

"Sacred Heart Catholic Parish exists to foster a community of disciples in response to the Gospel of Jesus Christ through Worship, Fellowship, Catholic Education and Service"



Starting soon at Sacred Heart will be an opportunity for small group fellowship, community, and adult Faith Formation through Bishop Robert Barron's new study on the Creed.

The Creed refers to foundational statements of belief. Our very first creed, for example, is the Sign of the Cross. "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." The sign of the cross itself comes from the great commission of Jesus given to the Apostles

and disciples just prior to Jesus' Ascension, body and soul, into Heaven wherein he said to them:

"Go and teach all nations (peoples), baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

These words are at the heart of our baptism and ultimately convey the most important relationship we have, namely, the relationship we have with God our Heavenly Father, who has adopted us as beloved sons and daughters, saved us through the cross of His only-begotten Son, and sent the Holy Spirit to dwell in our souls, thus making us temples of His presence. That is why we say we have sanctifying grace at our Baptism. For the Holy Spirit's presence within our soul makes us holy and righteous in God's sight.

The Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed which we profess at Sunday Mass are both elaborations of the baptismal creed.

The upcoming study with Bishop Robert Barron is an opportunity to grow in faith and fellowship with fellow parishioner's in small groups. I hope you will take this opportunity for faith enrichment by learning more about the foundational beliefs we have as Catholic Christians in the Creed. Saint of the Week-Examples of our Faith

St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 - 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350. We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.





In the fourth century, intense deliberations over theological questions gave rise to the Nicene Creed. This formal statement of faith is the foundation for both Eastern and Western Christianity, and to this day, most Christians around the world would

subscribe to it. In our age of secularism, skepticism, and disaffiliation, we should attend to the most basic issue first: What does it mean to believe in God?


