

Annual Mission Appeal Weekend

Every year as part of Mission Cooperation Program we host a missionary who makes the annual mission appeal. This weekend we welcome a priest of the Divine Word Missionaries, Fr. Lloyd Cunningham, SVD.

Divine Word Missionaries is the largest religious missionary community of men in the Church at this time. There are over 6,000 priests and brothers working in over 80 different countries. Saint Arnold Janssen founded the community in Steyl, Netherlands in 1875 to send missionaries to China. Soon after founding the Divine Word Missionaries for priests and brothers he founded two religious congregations of women, The Sister Servants of the Holy Spirit, SSpS and the Sister Servants of the Holy Spirit of Perpetual Adoration., commonly known as the Pink Sisters.

Here in this country the Society of the Divine Word founded the first African American Seminary in 1923 which after first being burned out by the Ku Klux Klan was resettled in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi. Our work continues as we educate future missionaries by living in intercultural communities that work in a variety of apostolates.

Fr. Lloyd Cunningham will be speaking about their project in Quilmes, Argentina. It is called Los Hogares de Madre Teresa de Calcutta. Los Hogares are seven houses of children and adolescents that house seventy children who have been placed there by the Argentina court system because of combinations of emotional, physical and sexual abuse. The children range in age from 3-17 years of age. The Divine Word Missionaries endeavor to provide a safe place to heal and grow for the future. They provide a place to live, education, and therapy so that the children will have a future.

Fr. Cunningham is also known in some circles as Doctor Lloyd Cunningham, doing psychological counseling for those struggling with various addictions. Most call him Fr. Sam. Sam is a nickname and translates better into Spanish. Presently he is an Associate Professor of Psychology at Divine Word College and works as a bilingual clinical psychologist who specialized in working with sex offenders and perpetrators of violence. He has been ordained now for forty-one years and has worked as a priest in Mexico, Bolivia, Paraguay, Brazil and the U.S.

Please welcome Fr. Lloyd Cunningham, SVD aka Fr. Sam. A second collection will be taken up this weekend to support the work of Divine Word Missionaries. After supporting our regular offertory I ask for an additional gift for this mission appeal. Let us give from the Heart of Christ to support the good work of Divine Word Missionaries.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

Why do the Gospels differ in their details? I was surprised to learn that not all of the Gospels tell the same stories, for example, the Nativity. Doesn't this take away from their credibility?

Answer:

Take any event that happens, from family trips to national politics and ask two or three different people to explain what happened. You will get a different version of the same story. People tend to tell the story from their perspective, and past experience shades what we recall and how we recall it. Our choice of words and what details we leave in or out is also influenced by the audience who is listening to our tales.

The Gospel writers are no different. Each one tells the story of Jesus from their own perspective. Versions differ in some details, not because one is true and the other is not, but because each Gospel writer, or Evangelist, has a different theological point to communicate as well as a different audience for whom he is writing. He picks and chooses the details of his Gospel based on what message he is preaching, what his audience may already know, and what message they need to hear. The various details of the Gospels point more to their authenticity as a record of the church's experience and understanding of Jesus. In a good study Bible, the background notes for each Gospel contain a lot of information that helps us better understand each Evangelist and his message.


