The Synod Evangelization Team

Last Tuesday, February 7th, the Synod Evangelization Team of the Church of the Sacred Heart, a Team Archbishop Hebda asked every Pastor to build after the model of Jesus and his twelve to help realize goals adopted by the 2022 Archdiocesan Synod, met for the first time in a seven week "School of Discipleship."

The members of the Synod Evangelization Team of the Church of the Sacred Heart, a group of Twelve include: Monica and Steve Thibault, Maureen and Tom Stanoch, Aaron and Jessica Fimon, Matt and Lizzie Chalberg, Morgan Leisgang (director of Elementary Faith Formation, and Middle School Religion Teacher), Matt Kruc (director of Youth and Young Adult ministry), Karen Bursey (School Principal) and Deacon James Ramsey.

Jeff Cavins, of the Archbishop Harry J. Flynn Catechetical Institute, led Synod Evangelization Teams meeting at 15 different locations in a simulcast. As our parish is close to Our Lady of Grace in Edina, our team is fortunate to attend the place where Jeff Cavins is presenting live and leading this effort. The focus of week 1 is to Follow Jesus which means:

- Moving from actively and passionately studying the Faith to living the Faith allows us to put sound knowledge into practice in a way that is consistent with God's will for our life.
 - o Challenge for the week: Throughout the day, with each conversation and each encounter, ask yourself, "what would Jesus say, or do?" Then, just do it.

The formation that our Synod Evangelization Team is now experiencing has been likened to "Tilling the Soil." As this process unfold the SET will help implement of the first pastoral priority Archbishop Hebda has identified which is establishing "Small Groups" based upon the Synod Proposition #19 from the 2022 Archdiocesan Synod Assembly which reads:

Create or grow a small group ministry at every parish that fosters personal relationships, builds community and provides formation to help parishioners grow as joyful missionary disciples of Christ.

- Types: Bible study, faith sharing, prayer, sacramental preparation, evangelization
- Varity of formats and common interest groups: couples, women, men, single, mixed age, similar stage of life
- Parishes may collaborate with other parishes on this ministry, as desired.

As our SET goes through the School of Discipleship, I ask for your prayers for me and all the Team members so that we may encounter our Lord Jesus Christ, the sower of the Seed, and allow the life of his Spirit to be renewed in us.

Holy Spirit, renew your wonders in our time, as though in a new Pentecost, and grant that this Archdiocese, united in prayer around Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and guided by St. Peter, may spread the Kingdom of the divine Savior, a Kingdom of truth, of justice, of love, and of peace. Amen.

Saint Paul, our great missionary patron, pray for us!



Egypt & Exodus-Part 2 As you read through the rest of Exodus, notice that God does not free Israel from slavery and then send them off as individuals to make their way to Canaan as best as they can. He forms them into a people, gives them laws to guide their behavior and worship, and provides them with a leadership structure. They are to march forth together, not under their own power but with the power of God. That is why we have the Church. We are all in this together. In the second half of Exodus, God's people become a nation and are given the Law, the Tabernacle, and the Levitical priesthood.




PRE-BAPTISM CLASSES



Why Do We Do That?

Vestment Colors

Ouestion:

What do the colors of the priest's and deacon's vestments mean?

Answer:

In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the colors of the vestments evolved over the course of several centuries and there was wide variation both in the colors used, and in the feasts and seasons associated with particular colors. It was Pope Innocent III (d. 1216) who gave us the basic outline that was later prescribed by Pope Saint Pius V in 1570. The various colors remind us of the dominant themes of a particular season or celebration.

- White: Used for the seasons of Christmas and Easter and in celebrations of the Lord, of Mary, the angels, and saints who were not martyrs. This color is also used in Masses for the dead, at baptisms, weddings and other festive celebrations.
- Red: As the color of both blood and fire, red is used on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, as well as Pentecost and special celebrations of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, red is used on the feasts and memorials of the Apostles and those saints who died as martyrs.
- Violet: The color for Advent and Lent. Violet may also be used in Masses for the dead and on All Souls Day (November 2).
- Green: A color of life and hope, green is used throughout Ordinary Time.

Other colors: Rose may be used on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, black may be used in Masses of the dead and on All Souls Day, gold or silver may be used on solemn occasions in place of white, red, or green.
