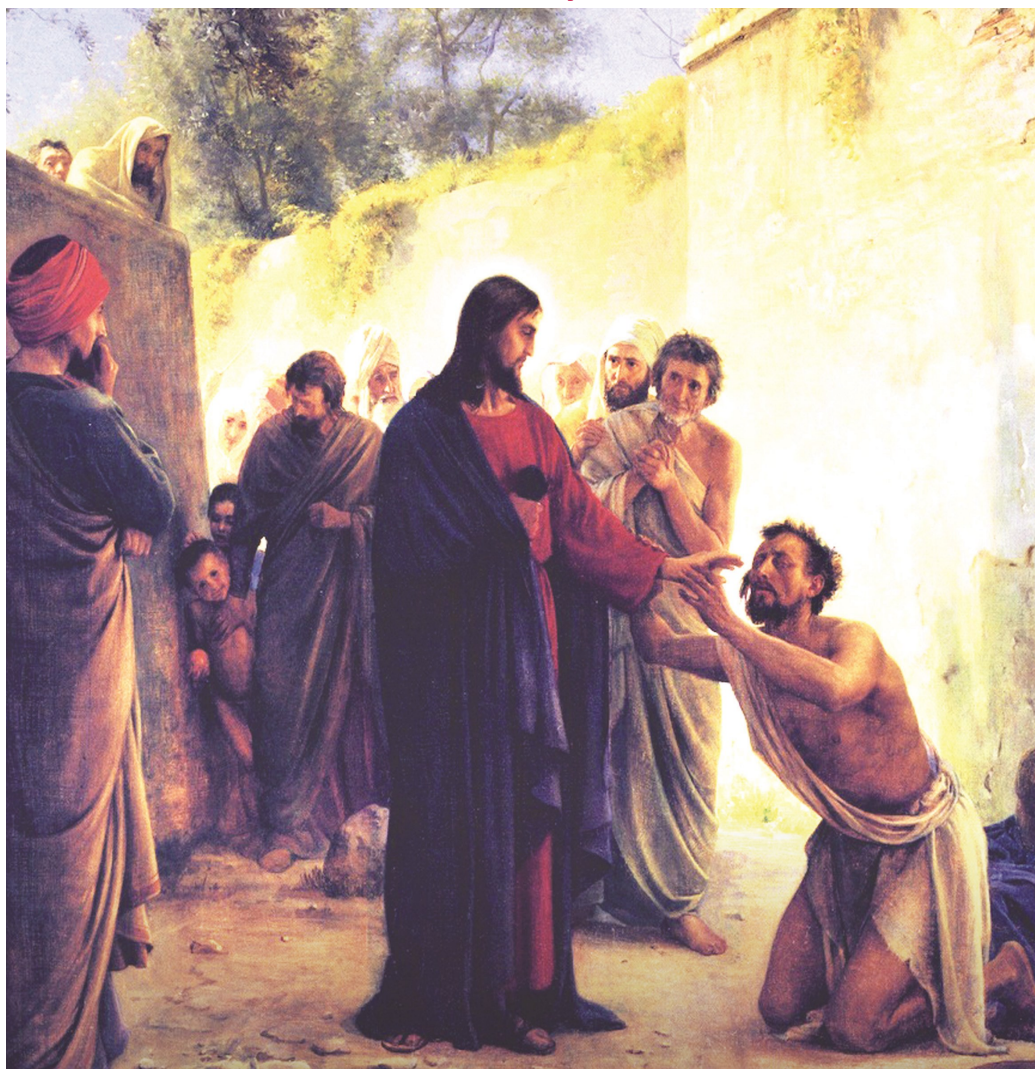

**New Translation: The Order of Penance – Part 1**

For those of you who have availed yourself of the Sacrament of Penance since Ash Wednesday you may have noticed some slight changes to the formula of absolution. This is because a new translation of the Order of Penance became available to use on Ash Wednesday. You may not hear the new formula until after Divine Mercy Sunday on April 16 when it will be the only English language translation allowed for use in the United States of America. You may recall nearly twelve years ago beginning on November 27, 2011, on the first Sunday of Advent a new translation of the Roman Missal, the book containing prayer for the Mass, came into use in the United States of America. The new translation of The Order of Penance coming into use in 2023 is part of that same process. As to why new translations were needed so badly let me quote the great Msgr. Richard J. Schuler, the late pastor of St. Agnes Parish, where I grew up, who died in 2007 just four years before a new translation of the Roman Missal in English would appear. In 1990, Msgr. Schuler wrote an editorial for *Sacred Music, a scholarly journal of the Church Music Association of America* where he served as editor for many years, commenting on a new book then released called *the Gregorian Missal, which brought the official Gregorian Chants of the Reformed Liturgy together in a book for Sundays and Feast days along with the Latin text of the Mass and the then English translation*. He wrote: "The official version of the liturgical texts for English-speaking nations (ICEL) is the version provided. [This is the translation that appeared in 1973. -Fr. Pedersen] One is not only appalled by the banality of that English translation, but what strikes one so forcibly is the damage done to the very content of the Latin prayers in what is supposed to pass as a translation. *Deus* is translated as Father; relative clauses are made into declarative sentences; *gratia* is never translated as grace. The Latin prayers are (scarcely) recognizable as the same composition in the parallel column. For example, here is the prayer over the gifts for the Second Sunday of Advent: *Placare, Domine, quaesumus, nostrae precibus humilitatis et hostiis, et, ubi nulla suppetunt suffragia meritorum, tuae nobis indulgentiae succurre praesidiis. [1970 Missale Romanum]* Lord, we are nothing without you. As you sustain us with your mercy, receive our prayers and offerings. [1973 English Translation] Be pleased, O Lord, with our humble prayers and offerings, and, since we have no merits to plead our cause, come, we pray, to our rescue with the protection of your mercy. [2010 English Translation] Or this oration from the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time: *Familiam tuam, quaesumus, Domine, continua pietate custodi, ut, quae in sola spe gratiae caelestis innititur, tua semper protectione muniat. [1970 Missale Romanum]* Father, watch over your family and keep us safe in your care, for all our hope is in you. [1973 English Translation] Keep your family safe, O Lord, with unfailing care, that, relying solely on the hope of heavenly grace, they may be defended always by your protection. [2010 English Translation] We have been deprived of the beauty of the prayers of the Latin liturgy, and we have at the same time been subjected to a poverty of expression in English which is truly a language of great beauty and power. Rather than transferring the classicism, the strength and the theological wisdom of the Latin texts, the translators have emasculated the Latin orations and having labored have not even produced a mouse." Next week I will share the main features of the new translation for the Order of Penance.

# THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

## WHAT?

The way we embrace Christ's call to **conversion**.

The step we take to express true **repentance** for our offenses.

The **confession** of our sins.

The reception of **God's pardon and peace**.

The **restoration** of our relationship with God  
and with the Church.

After Jesus declared that Peter would be the rock upon which he would build his Church, he said to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."  
(Mt 16:13-20)



After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples, extended his peace, breathed the holy Spirit on them, and sent them out saying, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."  
(Jn 20:19-23)

## WHY?

We were born with the effects of **original sin**: disobedience toward God and a lack of trust in his goodness (Gen 3:1-11).

God the Father sent his Son, **Jesus Christ**, to save us from our sins (Jn 3:16).

Jesus accomplished his saving mission by establishing the **Kingdom of God** and by suffering, dying on the cross, rising from the dead, and ascending into heaven (Mt 5:17).

Jesus established the **Church** to continue his saving mission by the power of the Holy Spirit through the celebration of the sacraments (Mk 1:15, Jn 19:34, Acts 2: 1-4, 2 Cor 5:18).

Through **faith** in the Gospel and **Baptism**, we are first washed clean of all sin (Acts 2:38).

Through the **Sacrament of Penance**, we continue to experience the forgiveness of our sins  
(Mt 16:13-20, Jn 20:19-23).



# How?

## THE ORDER OF PENANCE

The Church celebrates the Sacrament of Penance using the *Order of Penance*.

The revised rites and formulas of the *Order of Penance* of the Second Vatican Council were promulgated in 1973.

A new translation was provided in 2023.

Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance or “going to confession” is a liturgical action that consists of:

1. The Reception of the Penitent
2. The Reading of the Word of God (Optional)
3. The Confession of Sins and The Acceptance of Satisfaction
4. The Prayer of the Penitent and The Absolution
5. The Proclamation of Praise of God and The Dismissal of the Penitent

## THE ACTS OF THE PENITENT

1. Contrition (sorrow for sin)
2. Confession (inward examination, outward accusation)
3. Satisfaction (an act of penance)

"Penance requires . . . the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart, confess with the lips, and practice complete humility and fruitful satisfaction."

*(Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1450)*



## Going to Confession in Twelve Easy Steps

1. **Examine your conscience, call to mind your sins, and then enter the confessional.**
2. The priest will welcome and receive you.
3. **Make the sign of the cross and say:** "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."
4. The priest will invite you to trust in God. He may also read a text of Sacred Scripture.
5. **Say these or similar words:**  
"Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been \_\_\_\_\_ long since my last confession. These are my sins..."
6. **Tell the priest your sins. Then say these or similar words:** "For these and all of my sins, I am sorry."
7. **Accept your work of penance (prayers, act of kindness, etc.) to help make satisfaction and amend your life.**
8. **Express your sorrow for your sins (Act of Contrition) in these or similar words:**  
"O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done  
and for the good I have failed to do,  
because by sinning I have offended you,  
who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things.  
I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more,  
and to avoid the occasions of sin.  
Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy."
9. **Receive God's forgiveness as the priest prays the Prayer of Absolution.**
10. **At the end of the Prayer of Absolution, reply:** "Amen."
11. **Give praise to God. When the priest says:** "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good,"  
**conclude:** "For his mercy endures forever."
12. **Go in peace and remember to say or do your penance.**
