




Outdoor Vegetable Garden at Sacred Heart Catholic School

Our SAC committee applied for the Whole Kids Garden Grant and we received \$3000 to make it happen. The Garden grant program helps schools turn outdoor space into power-ful hands-on learning gardens that connect kids with food, spark curiosity, and support C-STEM curriculum.

A group of parents met last Saturday in Fr. Pedersen's garage to build two raised garden beds that will be placed on the corner of 40 1/2 Ave. N. and Hubbard Ave. (next to our Pre -K playground). 

This month we look at some locations within (or near) the City of Jerusalem: **The Tower of Antonia**

In the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd atrium, the children work with a raised surface model of the city of Jerusalem. Jerusalem is one of the most important cities in the land of Israel because Jesus lived the greatest moments of his earthly life there. The Tower of Antonia was on a high hill. At the time of Jesus, Israel was occupied or run by the Romans and the Roman government built the Tower of Antonia on the high hill so they could watch over the city. Jesus was taken to the Tower of Antonia, also called the Praetorium, where he was questioned by Pilate.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Does it matter what leg you kneel on when genuflecting?

Answer:

Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it's an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting, becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist. In our tradition, although many have been taught or prefer to genuflect by placing their right knee on the ground, there is no prescribed way to genuflect. This is especially important to keep in mind if physical limitations or age make certain movements difficult for us.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar. Shroud of Turin: What Can We Determine From Scientific Analysis? Among the few artefacts in the world, the Shroud of Turin has stirred the imagination, sparked controversy, raised speculations, and strengthened the faith of some. For nearly four centuries, the Shroud has resided in the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Turin, Italy. Millions of Christians perhaps consider it to be the burial shroud of Jesus of Nazareth. Controversy has surrounded the shroud from its initial discovery. The history and controversy will be discussed in this presentation along with the various interpretations of the image on the shroud including the evolving use of scientific methods to validate and or further challenge the legitimacy of the shroud and its proposed image of the crucified Christ.
