On Praying for the Dead: Biblical Testimony

In the second book of Maccabees there is an account of a battle where the armies of Judas Maccabeus are successful, as in any battle though some of his soldiers fell. It is what was discovered on them that caused Judas Maccabeus to make atonement for the dead by having sacrifices offered at the temple in Jerusalem. Here follows the account as found in 2 Maccabees 12:38-46. "Judas rallied his army and went to the city of Adullam. As the seventh day was approaching, they purified themselves according to custom and kept the Sabbath there. On the following day, since the task had now become urgent, Judas and his companions went to gather up the bodies of the fallen and bury them with their kindred in their ancestral tombs. But under the tunic of each of the dead they found amulets sacred to the idols of Jamnia, which the law forbids the Jews to wear. So it was clear to all that this was why these men had fallen. They all therefore praised the ways of the Lord, the just judge who brings to light the things that are hidden. Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out. The noble Judas exhorted the people to keep themselves free from sin, for they had seen with their own eyes what had happened because of the sin of those who had fallen. He then took up a collection among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch as he had the resurrection in mind; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead. But if he did this with a view to the splendid reward that awaits those who had gone to rest in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Thus, he made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sin." Praying for the dead is a noble and pious act in light of the Resurrection. When we pray for our loved ones, we act in the same way. One of the chief reasons a funeral mass is so important is because the Mass is the representation of the saving work of Jesus Christ. It is his offering that we enter into at every Mass. Across time and space the fruit of Mass is to make Jesus' saving death and resurrection present in our lives. Since it is his offering that saves us from our sins, to have Mass said for a loved one who has died is a great gift. Now it is true that we often have many Masses said for the dead. Is not one Mass sufficient? From an objective point of view one Mass is sufficient for it contains the grace of salvation that is found in Jesus' life, death and resurrection. The atoning sacrifice is perfect. What remains imperfect is our appropriation of this mystery. Just as receiving communion has the capacity to make our souls full of grace, it is often the case that we are not yet capable of receiving the entirety of God's love. This is where our prayers enter into the picture. We believe that God works through his creation, whether through angels, through nature, or through us, we are instruments for God. This means that our Lord delights in us as we dedicate our prayers and good works to Him for the benefit of both the living and the dead. This gives meaning to an important teaching found in St. Paul's letter to the Colossians 1:24-27. "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church, of which I am a minister in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past. But now it has been manifested to his holy ones to whom God chose to make known the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; it is Christ in you, the hope for glory." We must not forget to pray for our beloved dead especially in having Masses offered for them. If you would like to have a Mass offered for your loved one whether living or deceased, you can contact the Parish Office. Every Mass has what is known as a ministerial intention." This intention can be for a person who is living, a person who is deceased, or for some other petition. For example, last Sunday the ministerial intention listed was "Celebrant's Intention. I offered that "ministerial intention of that Mass for peace in Israel and Gaza. It is customary to offer a donation when a Mass is offered. The recommended donation is \$7.00. Some people might offer a donation of \$10 or even \$20 as a Mass offering. Sometimes people will ask me to say a Mass and they may have little to offer except their own prayers. These donations defray the cost of the materials associated with saying Mass, such as the wine and bread, and other tangible elements of the Mass. The greatest form of prayer we have is the Mass, if someone has asked you to pray for them, it would be very noble and excellent to request a Mass to be said for them. When it comes to having a Mass offered for those living, birthdays and anniversary days are very apt days to have a formal Mass offered. What an amazing gift. For those who have died, it is good to have Masses for them offered on the anniversary date of their death, or a day close to their day of death. Every year on the anniversary of the deaths of past pastors such as Fr. Jeremiah Harrington, Fr. William Blum, Fr. Francis Nolan, Fr. Wallace Hermes, Fr. John McGrath, and Fr. Bob Zasacki, we have a Mass offered for them. As we remember these past priest and others for whom Masses are offered, we show love for them by our prayers even as we hope that they already enjoy the fullness of heavenly life.
